

**AN ACT** to amend an act entitled "an act to prevent the sale of intoxicating liquors to Indians," approved January 8th, 1840.

*Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin.*

**SECTION 1.** That when any offence shall hereafter be committed under the first section of the act to which this is amendatory, it shall be lawful to prosecute the offender by indictment in the district court of the proper county, and upon conviction; the offender shall be punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding three months, or both in the discretion of the court. Offender how prosecuted.

**SEC. 2.** It shall be the duty of the several district courts of this Territory to give this act, and the act to which it is amendatory, specially in charge to each grand jury that may be empanelled in the several districts; but nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the prosecution for such offences before justices of the peace as heretofore. District courts to give this act in charge.

**AN ACT** to organize the town of Ceresco, in the County of Fond du Lac.

*Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:*

**SECTION 1.** That townships numbered 16, north of ranges numbered fourteen and fifteen east, in the county of Fond du Lac, be and are hereby organized into a separate town by the name of Ceresco. Boundaries.

**SEC. 2.** The legal voters of said town, shall hold their first town meeting at the house of Lester Rounds, on the first Tuesday of April next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, without any other notice than the passage of this act. First Town meeting.

**SEC. 3.** All subsequent meetings, shall be held at such place as the town meeting shall from time to time direct. Where held.
