JOINT RESOLUTION

Continuing the joint interim committee on silicosis.

Whereas, The joint interim committee appointed under authority of Joint Resolution No. 155, A., adopted by the 1933 session of the legislature to study the problem of silicosis, has reported the progress it has made in its investigation under such resolution; and

WHEREAS, Such committee has requested that it be continued and that the scope of its inquiry be broadened to include a study of silicosis in industry generally; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That such committee is authorized to continue its investigation of the subject of silicosis in the granite cutting industry and also in industry generally in which silicosis is a hazard and that such investigation be made under the authority already vested in such committee under the terms of the resolution under which it was originally organized and that such committee make its report to the governor and to the legislature at its next regular session.
