Reconstruction Finance Corporation moneys deposited by the governor or unemployment relief trustees in a public depository which has failed to repay on demand constitute a valid claim against the state public deposit fund. ## CHAPTER 35.

## Public Printing and the Distribution of Laws and Public Documents.

General Comment of Interim Committee on State Publications, 1959:

This bill [617, S] is the first comprehensive revision of ch. 35 of the statutes since 1931. It is the product of a study made by the interim subcommittee on state publications in accordance with amendment No. 1, S. to Jt. Res. No. 97, S., passed by the 1957 legislature.

Proposed changes in ch. 35 are intended to improve the printing processes of the state by the clarification of existing sections, the repeal of obsolete material, the strengthening of some sections, and the institution of stronger controls over state printing and distribution programs. These changes are designed to

promote greater efficiency and economy in state printing. Chapter 35 has been reorganized into sub-divisions so that sections on like subjects are grouped together instead of scattered through-out the chapter.

grouped together instead of scattered through-out the chapter. The chapter has been rendered more flexible by the transfer of numerous technical details, including base prices, to administrative deter-mination and to the specifications pamphlet which is a part of the printing contract. This will facilitate necessary changes in specifica-tions at each bidding period for state contract

printing. Sections which have no bearing on the op-eration of ch. 35 have been transferred to ch. 251. Sections of ch. 13 which are related to state printing have been transferred to ch. 35.

state printing have been transferred to ch. 35. Editor's Note: Ch. 35 was repealed and re-created by ch. 516, laws of 1959 (Bill 617, S). The following table is designed to assist in tracing the various provisions of the old law into the new sections created by this bill. It does not show (except in the case of complete repeals) what specifically happened to a par-ticular provision of the old law, i.e., whether it was substantially changed or restated with-out change. The board of regents of the university, which is declared to be a body corporate by 36.03, Stats. 1921, has no powers except such as are conferred upon it by the express language of the statute, or by fair or necessary implication therefrom. 12 Atty. Gen. 50.

The regents have authority to convey land to the United States for a proper university purpose. 37 Atty. Gen. 251.
