CHAPTER 44.

State Historical Society and Local Historical Societies.

The state historical society is an official agency and trustee of the state and has no liability for negligent operation or maintenance of elevators which could properly be made the subject of public liability insurance. 39 Atty. Gen. 110.

The state historical society has the right to hold general meetings as a private corporation and it may invite members of junior chapters to attend. 43 Atty. Gen. 190.

The state historical society has no power to enter into a contract with a private book company whereby said company would publish and distribute a book written by an employee of the society as part of her regular duties and in return the society would receive a royalty on each volume. 34 Atty. Under 44.01, Stats. 1947, and ch. 17, Laws 1853, the state historical society may lease for a term of more than 3 years lands owned by the society but not presently used by it. 37 Atty. Gen. 417.

The state historical society is required to deposit with the state treasurer all funds received by grant, bequest or otherwise. While said society may not sell its personal property generally and other than as permitted by 44.01, Stats. 1945, it may sell waste paper, worn out equipment and the like in the interests of sound administration and deposit the proceeds with the state treasurer. 36 Atty. Under 45.055, Stats. 1947, a county board may contract with, and make an appropriation to, a nonprofit hospital corporation without capital stock organized pursuant to 45.05 and may levy a tax therefor provided the facilities of the hospital are available to the residents of the county without discrimination. 37 Atty. Gen. 591.

A county board may appropriate money to a nonprofit corporation to maintain a memorial hospital where the conditions of 45.055 are met. 49.16 and 49.17, Stats. 1957, would not apply. 46 Atty. Gen. 226.

Condemnation of private property is not justified under an agreement between Milwaukee County and a corporation organized for the purposes specified in 45.05 where the project was subject to abandonment in various contingencies, since development of the site for public use was too uncertain. The authority to enter into such agreement under 45.055 does not give to municipalities condemnation authority which the municipality, acting alone, would not have. Schumm v.
