Dear Mr. Melvin:

I am pleased to forward to you the Report of the Study Committee on Health Care for Persons with Disabilities as mandated in the 1987-89 Budget Bill (Act 57) adopted by the Legislature. I would appreciate it if you would distribute this report to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172 (3), Wis. Stat.

The legislature did not specify a lead agency for this collaborative study by the Department of Health and Social Services, The Department of Industry, Labor and

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Human Relations, The Office of the Commissioner of Insurance, and the Health Insurance Risk-Sharing Plan (HIRSP) Board of Governors. My Office has assumed that lead role by convening a study committee and assigning staff to conduct research and draft the final report.

In the interval since this study was requested, the Department of Health and Social Services has been authorized by the Legislature to conduct a pilot of a solely state-funded Medicaid program to provide health care coverage for persons with disabilities eligible for SSI or SSDI who work or wish to work. As part of this effort, DHSS will be conducting a broad survey for the general population in a pilot county and a targeted survey of the

health care coverage needs of persons with disabilities. Therefore, committee members recommend that the information and recommendations contained in this report be incorporated in survey research plans for the pilot program and in the analysis and evaluation DHSS undertakes at the pilot's conclusion.
