To the Honorable, the Senate:

Wisconsin's acid rain control law (1985 Wisconsin Act 296) was enacted by the legislature in March 1986 and signed into law in April 1986. The law established emission limits and annual emission goals for sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides to control acid rain in Wisconsin. The law also directs the Department of Natural Resources to prepare an annual report which states the total nitrogen oxide and sulfur dioxide emissions from all stationary air contaminant sources in Wisconsin in order to track the emissions relative to the limits and goals set in the law. This 1986 Sulfur Dioxide and Nitrogen Oxide Emissions Report is the second of these annual reports and satisfies the requirements of the law.
