ACTION ON THE SENATE MESSAGE

Senate Bill 201

Relating to: establishing a correctional institution in the town of Brockway in Jackson county; establishing a correctional institution in the city of Milwaukee; community residential confinement; the challenge incarceration program; a prisoner reintegration program in Milwaukee county; reports on prisoners; correctional officer training; recruitment, examination and certification procedures for filling positions in the department of corrections; crime victim compensation; rights of and services for crime victims and witnesses; crime victim services in populous counties; providing a grant to the city of Milwaukee for police substations; studying homicide; establishing a state public defender caseload standard for first-degree intentional homicide; creating a council on alcohol and other drug abuse treatment; establishing a program of grants for family preservation services, and requiring a county that has a population of 500,000 or more that is awarded a family preservation grant to purchase family preservation services under the grant from a nonprofit corporation; providing funding for alcohol and other drug abuse treatment in Milwaukee county; establishing a program of grants to provide community service jobs in a county that has a population of 500,000 or more; establishment of a Wisconsin service corps under the department of industry, labor and human relations to provide community services projects in a county with a population of 500,000 or more; intensive treatment and aftercare for girls at Lincoln Hills school; providing funding to the police athletic league in a city that has a population of over 500,000; cost reimbursement of additional court commissioners in the 1st judicial administrative district, creating one additional circuit

court in Milwaukee county, designating 4 circuit courts to primarily handle crimes involving violence, and providing court staff; granting court commissioners powers to accept guilty pleas and impose certain sentences and to conduct uncontested proceedings in certain juvenile court cases; court commissioner powers regarding harassment; surveillance equipment on Milwaukee county transit system buses; providing exemptions from rule-making procedures; granting bonding authority; and making appropriations.
