To the Honorable, the Assembly:

Wisconsin Act 122, creating section 51.025 of the Wisconsin State Statutes, required the creation of a state task force to study controlled substance use by pregnant women and women with young children. The task force was required to submit a preliminary report, by June 1, 1990, to the Chief Clerk of each house of the legislature; and a final report, by July 1, 1991, to the legislature.

A 28 member task force was appointed, consisting of experts in the areas of health, alcohol and other drug abuse, child development and social services. The Task Force was chaired by Dr. Fredrik Broekhuizen, M.D., of the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee Clinical Campus, Medical School. The Task Force met from May 14, 1990 to June 17, 1991.

You received the Task Force's preliminary report May 30, 1990. This letter and its attachment constitute the required July 1, 1992 final report. The Secretary of the Department of Health and Social Services charged the Task Force to complete its work by July 1, 1991 -- one

year early -- so that its recommendations could be considered in a more timely manner.
