To the Honorable, the Assembly:

We have audited the financial statements of WHA Radio and Television (public telecommunications entities operated by the University of Wisconsin-Extension) for the year ended June 30, 1995 and have issued our reports on these statements, dated December 26, 1995.

The audit was requested by the University of Wisconsin-Extension to fulfill the audit requirements of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. The Corporation requires audited financial statements of public broadcasting entities and certification of these entities' non-federal revenue sources in determining future funding levels.

The audit reports include no major findings, conclusions, or recommendations, and, in our judgement, are not likely to be of interest to most members of the Legislature.
