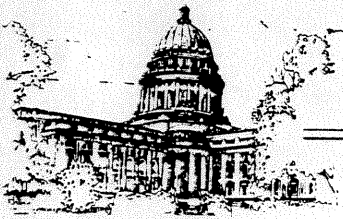

Dear Chairman and Committee members;

As an author of Assembly Bill (AB) 60, I'd like to thank you for providing me the opportunity to testify on behalf of a positive measure for farmers and property owners.

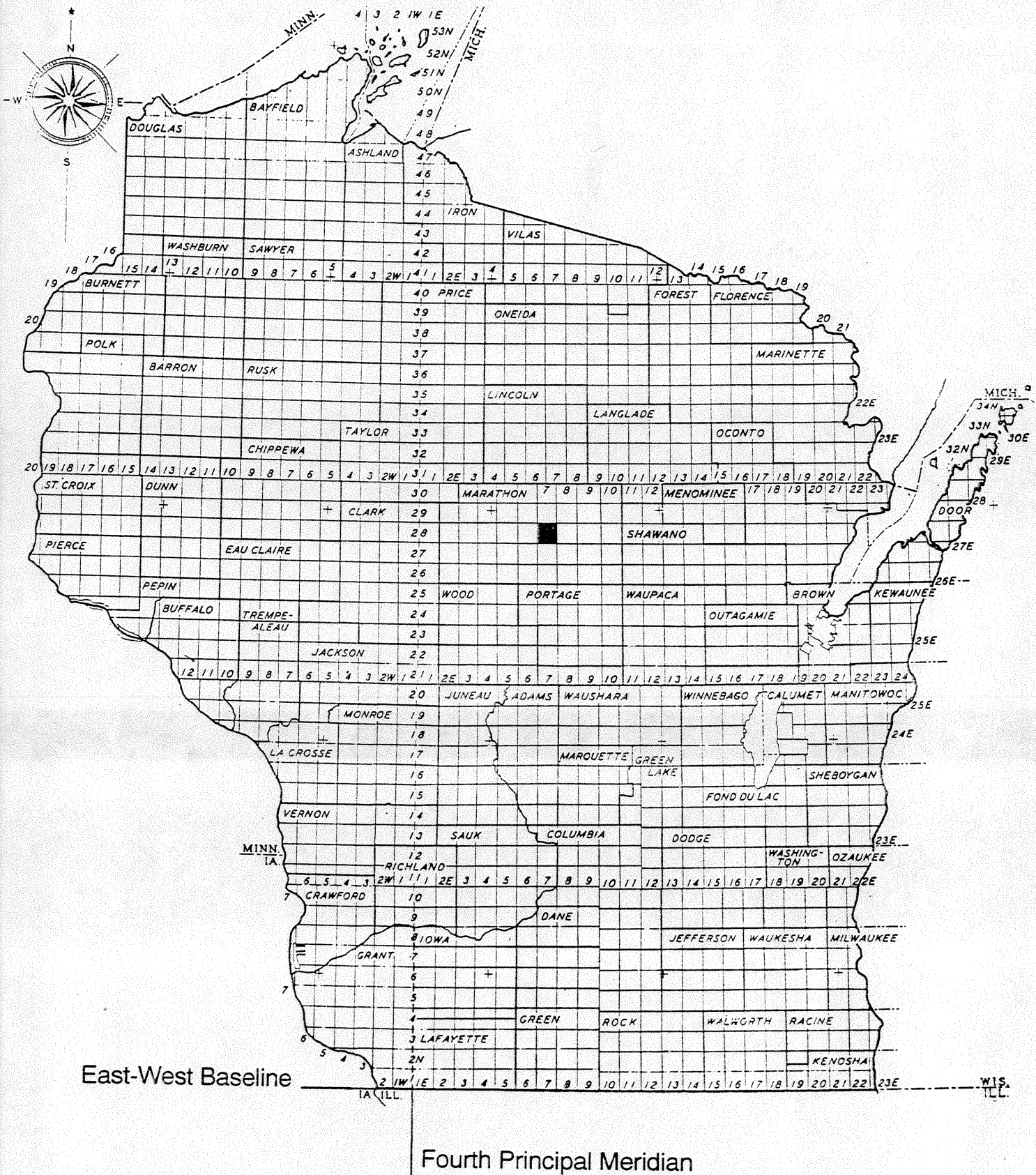
Property boundaries are of great importance to farmers, and at times owners have had conflicts over where their boundaries are located, whose fence allowed livestock to break out of the pasture, and who was liable for the damages. As a result, our forefathers developed Chapter 90 of the Wisconsin Statutes to address these problems.

Today, I request two changes be made. One, to provide for larger distances between posts, lowering costs associated with putting up a fence. The other is to provide farmers with an alternative to requiring fences between properties, making a provision that reflects today's cultural practices.

1.) The fence posts distance apart in 90.02 (2) states "all wires must be tightly stretched and securely fastened to sufficient posts firmly set not more than 16 feet apart." This bill requests that the distance be changed from 16 to 20 feet.

Today we have what is referred to as "high tensile wire." The weight to be supported by the post is greatly diminished, therefore





The above map may be used to identify townships in Wisconsin according to the U.S. Rectangular Land Survey. To find a specific area's township number, first locate it on the map and then count the number of squares it lies from the east-west baseline (Wisconsin-Illinois border). To find the township's range number, count the number of squares it lies east or west of the Fourth Principal Meridian. The shaded square indicates Township 28 North, Range 7 East, which is located 28 squares north of the baseline, and 7 squares east of the Fourth Principal Meridian. (Wisconsin Index Map, by H.F.
