prospective adult residents of those entities; copayments under the medical assistance program for specialized medical vehicle services; the delegation of authority by local units of government over funds held in trust for certain pension plans; the transportation and sale of fish; restrictions on the placement of sexually violent persons who are granted supervised release; eliminating cross-references to the Wisconsin works health plan; tax increment sharing for tax incremental financing districts in Oshkosh that contain polluted soil; specific information signs along STH 172; weight limitations for vehicles and combinations of vehicles transporting bulk potatoes; grants awarded by the environmental education board that are related to forestry; provision of information necessary for the administration of child support and economic support programs; and making an appropriation.
