FACT: The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources reports that no sulfide mine in a similar ore body has ever operated without polluting ground and surface waters. Nationwide, over 500,000 mining sites are contaminated and 52 of these are on the National Superfund Cleanup list.

FACT: Existing Wisconsin mining laws and DNR rules are riddled with loopholes and do not protect Wisconsin's taxpayers and environment from mining pollution and cleanup costs.

FACT: The Sulfide Mining Moratorium Bill, introduced by Representative Spencer Black, will prohibit the DNR from permitting a mine in a sulfide ore body in Wisconsin until a similar mine has been operated elsewhere in the United States or Canada for at least 10 years without causing significant pollution of area groundwater or surface water.

FACT: Wisconsin's economy and environment cannot afford to be EXXON's guinea pig for unproven mining technology.

FACT: This important bill will only pass with the strong support of conservationists from all parts of Wisconsin.

Dear Committee Member:

I am the 20th District Supervisor for Sauk County. I also publish three weekly newspapers in Sauk County, the Baraboo Sun, Reedsburg Report, and the Sauk Prairie Eagle. I also publish the weekly, free circulation Shopper Stopper that reaches 100,000 households primarily in Sauk, Columbia, Marquette and Dane County.

My county district includes the Village and Town of Merrimac, which border on Lake Wisconsin, the lake created behind the Wisconsin River dam at Prairie du Sac. As you may know, the Sauk and Columbia County area is famous for its tourist attractions, the Wisconsin Dells, the Merrimac Ferry, the Eagle habitat at Prairie du Sac and many others located on the Wisconsin River. In fact, Sauk County is ranked third in the state in total tourism sales. Needless to say, many of us depend on the Wisconsin River and its water quality for our livelihood.

The Crandon Mining Company (CMC), owned by Exxon Corporation, has applied to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to operate a sulfide copper mine at Crandon, Wisconsin, near the Wolf River, and to pump one million gallons per day, or over 10 billion gallons over the 30-year operating life of the mine of treated mining wastewater, to the Wisconsin River at Hat Rapids near Rhinelander through a 38-mile pipeline.

According to the DNR, just some of the chemicals and metals that will be dumped into the Wisconsin River are Ammonia, Nitrate, Chloride, Fluoride, Phosphorus, Boron, Cyanide, Aluminum, Antimony, Arsenic, Barium, Beryllium, Cadmium, Calcium, Chromium, Copper, Iron, Lead, Magnesium, Manganese, Mercury, Molybdenum, Nickel, Potassium, Selenium, Silver, Sodium, Sulfate, Thallium and Zinc.¹ When asked why the CMC would not treat the wastewater and put it in the Wolf River, the DNR answered², "The Wolf River is an Outstanding Resource Water (the highest water quality classification), so any discharges to it must be of a higher quality than a discharge to the Wisconsin River. This is because the

Wisconsin River is of a lower use classification (a warm water sport fish water). If Crandon Mine Company proposed a discharge to the Wolf River system, it would require a very expensive and sophisticated treatment system."

According to George Meyer, head of the DNR³: "It (CMC) considered discharging into the Wolf River, the Pelican River and other streams, and a project site seepage system before choosing the Wisconsin River as its preferred alternative." He went on to say, "The Department does not have the authority to require an applicant for a surface water discharge permit to discharge to any particular surface water. As long as any applicant can demonstrate that it can meet the effluent limits and other requirements for a particular discharge site, we must grant the permit."

Rodney Harrell, president of CMC, in a recent interview with me said that the pipeline will cost 20 million dollars, while treating the wastewater to the Wolf River or to on-site groundwater seepage standards would cost 40 million dollars, a difference of 20 million dollars.

The bottom line is that CMC wants to get rid of its wastewater for the least amount of money by avoiding the DNR-imposed high water quality standards at the mine site, and the additional treatment it would require to meet those standards. CMC can save 20 million dollars by providing only minimum treatment of the wastewater, and then pumping that water 38 miles to the Wisconsin River, where the water is already much dirtier than the Wolf River, and the DNR water quality standards are very much lower.

The Wisconsin River is already a river at risk. One hundred sixty-one municipalities, paper mills, and other manufacturers with DNR permits discharge all kinds of chemicals and metals into it. (See enclosed.) Last year alone there were 675 apparent violations of these permit limits on the Wisconsin River.⁴ Another 27 municipalities and 46 industries located in the Wisconsin River drainage basin, now discharging to groundwater, will probably change their discharge to the river or one of its tributaries due to a recent increase in nitrate and phosphorus standards in groundwater, resulting in millions of additional gallons of wastewater to be dumped into the Wisconsin. Farm run-off and faulty septic systems add to the problems.

In 1997, the DNR issued "Fish Advisories"⁵ for mercury, PCB, and dioxin contamination of certain fish all along the Wisconsin and warned humans against eating these fish in various quantities on different parts of the river.

According to another DNR report on toxic chemicals released in 1997⁶, the Wisconsin River is once again the top receiver of toxic chemicals receiving a whopping 1,959,244 pounds of toxic chemicals in 1995.

In still another report from the DNR⁷, 10 segments of the Wisconsin River or its tributaries are listed as impaired.

Although the Wisconsin River has improved from the way it was back in the sixties, it should be gradually getting better and better, not staying the same or getting worse. The DNR water quality standards for the Wolf, the Fox and the entire Lake Michigan drainage basin, and of course groundwater, are higher than the Wisconsin, and if CMC or any other distant mine, manufacturer or municipality is allowed to start building long pipelines, the Wisconsin will never get any better.

As you know, many Wisconsin municipalities and businesses which are not located near a stream or river treat their wastewater to groundwater standards, including the City of Crandon. There is no reason, in my opinion, that the CMC should not be required to clean up their wastewater to groundwater standards, and return the treated water back to the groundwater at the site of the mine.

The bad news is Exxon and Rio Algom, the parent companies of Crandon Mining Company, have spent and continue to spend a lot of money lobbying in Madison. In addition, our Governor Tommy Thompson has been actively supporting the mine since the beginning, according to the senators and representatives I have talked to.

The good news is that since the summer of 1996, 42 counties, cities, villages and towns located on the Wisconsin River have passed resolutions opposing the pipeline, and in most cases, the mine and the pipeline. Enclosed find a copy of these resolutions. Also find a list of these communities and others from around the state who have passed various resolutions opposing the mine or pipeline.


We, the people and their representatives along the Wisconsin River, are the ones who have a vested interest and care the most about the Wisconsin River. The only thing we will receive from the Crandon Mine is 10 billion gallons of mining wastewater over the next 30 years. It is critical that the Wisconsin Assembly weighs in on the issue and joins the people, municipalities, and state legislators who have opposed the mine or the pipeline. The battle to save the Wisconsin River from the added "mining wastewater" is far from over. Exxon Corporation, the owner of the Crandon Mine, and other mining companies who are currently exploring all over northern, western and southwestern Wisconsin are not about to give up easily. They have the money and the lobbyists.

Please support the Mining Moratorium Bill.

OPPOSING THE CRANDON MINE 38 MILE WASTEWATER PIPELINE TO THE WISCONSIN RIVER

The Crandon Mining Company, owned by Exxon Corporation and others, is proposing to operate a copper and zinc sulfide mine near Crandon, Wisconsin, and then pump up to 1,000,000 gallons per day of mining wastewater through a 38-mile pipeline to the Wisconsin River near Rhinelander. The environmental effects of sulfide mining would be disastrous. Besides polluting surface and ground waters, the acid mine drainage would threaten federal natural trust resources such as the Wolf River. Secondly, the economic benefits of this mine project are doubtful. A boom and bust cycle plus threats to tourism and in-state jobs tend to minimize the economic benefits of such a mine.

This proposal could set a precedent for building long pipelines to transport waste water to the Wisconsin River in order to avoid local water quality standards. The Wolf, Fox and all rivers emptying into the Great Lakes have higher water quality standards than the Wisconsin. If the Crandon Mine is allowed to transport mining wastewater to the Wisconsin River, other distant mines, manufacturers or city sewer systems will seek to be allowed to do the same.

The Wisconsin River and its water quality are extremely important to the residents of the county of Dane, many of whom either live on it or close to it and fish, swim, boat, and otherwise enjoy it. A number of county residents earn a livelihood from the tourists attracted by the river, and any lowering of the water quality would cause harm to the county and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the County of Dane opposes the issuance of a permit to Crandon Mining Company to construct and operate a 38-mile wastewater pipeline to the Wisconsin River and further opposes the issuance of a permit (to anyone) to transport wastewater over long distances to the Wisconsin River in order to avoid local water quality standards.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution and the roll call sheet be provided to Governor Tommy Thompson and to state legislators representing Dane County.

A Resolution Opposing The Proposed Crandon Mine And The 38 Mile Wastewater Pipeline To The Wisconsin River.

WHEREAS the Crandon Mining Company, which is owned by Exxon Corporation and others, is proposing to operate a copper and zinc sulfide mine near Crandon, Wisconsin and this mine, once operating, would pump 1,000,000 gallons of mining wastewater per day through a 38 mile pipeline to the Wisconsin River near Rhinelander, and

WHEREAS the environmental effects of such a mine would be disastrous, including polluting surface and groundwaters and threatening Federal natural trust resources such as the Wolf River and, secondly, the economic benefits of this mine are doubtful, as mines typically operate on a boom or bust cycle plus such a mine would pose a threat to tourism and to the jobs it creates, and

WHEREAS the construction of this mine would set a precedent for building other long pipelines to transport wastewater to the Wisconsin River in order to avoid local water quality standards and, if the Crandon mine is allowed to transport mining wastewater to the Wisconsin River, other distant mines, manufacturers and city sewer systems may be allowed to do the same, and

WHEREAS the Wisconsin River and its water quality are extremely important to the citizens of Richland County, many of whom live on it or close to it and fish, swim, boat and otherwise enjoy the River, and many citizens earn a livelihood from the tourists attracted by the River, and any lowering of the water quality of the River would cause great harm to the County and to its residents, and

WHEREAS the County Board now desires to go on record in opposition to the proposed Crandon mine.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Richland County Board of Supervisors that Richland County hereby opposes the issuance of a permit to the Crandon Mining Company to operate a silver and zinc sulfide mine at Crandon and to construct a 38 mile wastewater pipeline to the Wisconsin River, and County further opposes the issuance of a permit to anyone to transport wastewater for long distances to the Wisconsin River in order to avoid local water quality standards, and
