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Exemption for Interest on Bonds Issued by the District

Bonds issued by the district would be exempt from Wisconsin income tax. The revenue effect would depend on the size of the bond offering, the interest rate on the bonds, the amounts of bonds held by individuals subject to Wisconsin tax and the tax rates imposed on these bond holders (rates on individuals range from 4.6% to 6.75% beginning in tax year 2001). Assuming an issue of \$160 million, an annual interest rate of 6.25% and an average marginal tax rate of 6.5%, the first year revenue loss if all bonds were issued and held by individuals subject to Wisconsin income tax would be about \$650,000 (\$160 million X .0625 X 0.065). With an issue totaling \$160 million, a 6.25% interest rate and a 30-year repayment period, the total revenue loss over the repayment period would be about \$12.7 million, assuming that the bonds are maturing as serial bonds.

Administrative Costs and Program Revenues

Assuming the district enacts the tax, the Department of Revenue (DOR) would incur ongoing expenses of \$201,400 and 2.5 FTE's to administer the tax on behalf of the district. There would also be one-time development costs of \$324,500. The bill would allow DOR to retain 1.5% of the taxes collected on behalf of the district to cover its administrative expenses. Assuming revenues of \$15.5 million, these revenues to the state would be \$232,500.
