

Comments

[NOTE: All citations to "Manual" in the comments below are to the Administrative Rules Procedures Manual, prepared by the Revisor of Statutes Bureau and the Legislative Council Staff, dated September 1998.]

2. Form, Style and Placement in Administrative Code

- a. Since s. ElBd 6.05 currently exists, the rule revision should declare that s. ElBd 6.05 (2), (3), (4) and (6) are amended, rather than declaring that s. ElBd 6.05 is created.
- b. The amendment to s. ElBd 6.05 (2) should show the phrase "January 1, 1999, covering activity on or after January" stricken through followed by the underscored word "July." The second occurrence of "1999" should not be affected.
- c. The word "any" in the proposed amendment to s. ElBd 6.05 (3) should be shown stricken followed by the underscored word "Any."

El.Bd. 6.05

1. Findings of fact:

The State Elections Board finds that because of the time required for development of the software necessary to implement electronic filing of campaign finance reports, electronic filing will not be available until after July 1, 1999. The amendment to the rule eliminates optional electronic filing between January 1, 1999 and July 1, 1999 and requires registrants who file a report electronically to file electronically thereafter. The Elections Board finds that the rule's list of reports that may be filed electronically inadvertently failed to include several reports that may be filed electronically and ought to be added to the rule's list.

The Elections Board also finds that the legislature has directed it to promulgate rules to regulate campaign finance reporting and to ensure the proper administration of that reporting. The Board finds that a rule authorizing and requiring electronic filing of campaign finance reports will facilitate compliance with Wisconsin's campaign finance law and the public's and the reporting of campaign finance activity.

Finally, the Board finds that a public hearing is not required by the statutes, and that a public hearing has neither been requested nor is necessary to the creation of this rule.

2. Conclusion and recommended action:

The State Elections Board unanimously concludes that ch. ElBd. 6.05 should be amended. The amendment of this rule is necessary to preclude voluntary electronic filing before July 1, 1999 and to amplify which campaign finance reports may be filed electronically after July 1, 1999. The rule is also necessary to require those who file electronically to continue to file electronically thereafter. The Board recommends promulgation of this rule.

3. Explanations of modifications to the proposed rule:

The State Elections Board makes no substantive modifications to this rule.

4. List of persons appearing at the public hearing:

No public hearing was held. The rule was submitted pursuant to the 30-day notice procedure of s.227.16(2)(e), Stats. No person who will be affected by the rule filed a petition for a public hearing within the 30-day period provided by that statute.

The State Elections Board adopts the Legislative Council's staff's comments and has incorporated the suggested changes in the rule with no exceptions.

WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

STATE ELECTIONS BOARD

SECTION 1. s.ElBd. 6.05(2), (3), (4), and (6) are amended to read:

ELBD 6.05 FILING CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORTS IN ELECTRONIC FORMAT

- (2) Beginning with any campaign finance report filed on or after January 1, 1999, eovering activity on or after January July 1, 1999, any registrant who files with the state elections board and who accepts contributions or makes disbursements in a total amount or value of \$20,000 or more during a campaign period shall file each campaign finance report that is required to be filed by Chapter 11, Stats., in an electronic format.
- (3) Beginning with the Fall 1998 preprimary report, covering activity from July 1, 1998, through the close of the reporting period, any Any registrant not required to file reports electronically may elect to file any campaign finance report in an electronic format.
- (4) Any campaign finance report filed in an electronic format shall be transmitted in time to be received by the filing officer no later than the time provided by law for filing the report.

 Any registrant who files a campaign finance report electronically shall, thereafter, file electronically all campaign finance reports required to be filed by the registrant.
- (6) Each registrant who files a report in an electronic format shall file, with the filing officer, a paper copy of the report that complies with the format set forth in Forms EB-2, <u>EB-2a</u>, EB-3, <u>EB-4</u>, EB-7, EB-10, <u>EB-10a</u>, EB-12 or EB-24. The paper copy of the report shall be signed by an individual authorized by the registrant to file and filed no later than the time prescribed by law for filing the report.
