**SUBJECT:** 1999 Assembly Bill 571, Relating to Repealing the Transition Position Regarding the Name of the Head of the Legislative Council Staff (Suggested as Remedial Legislation by the Legislative Council Staff)

This memorandum describes 1999 Assembly Bill 571, relating to repealing the transition position regarding the name of the head of the Legislative Council Staff. This bill is suggested as remedial legislation by the Legislative Council Staff, and was introduced by the Law Revision Committee. Assembly Bill 571 passed the Assembly on a voice vote on February 1, 2000. It is currently in the Senate Committee on Economic Development, Housing and Government Operations.

Prior to the passage of 1987 Wisconsin Act 27 (the 1987-89 Biennial Budget Act), the Director of the Legislative Council Staff was appointed by and served at the pleasure of the Joint Legislative Council. Other legislative service agency directors, however, are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Joint Committee on Legislative Organization (JCLO). Because of this, 1987 Wisconsin Act 27 designated JCLO as the appointing authority for the Legislative Council Staff Director. In doing so, it also created s. 13.90 (1m), Stats., to clarify that the then Director of the Legislative Council Staff, Bonnie Reese, would continue to serve at the pleasure of the Joint Legislative Council for the duration of her term. Bonnie Reese retired from the Legislative Council Staff on November 21, 1989. Her retirement made the existence of s. 13.90 (1m), Stats., superfluous.

1999 Assembly Bill 571 repeals s. 13.90 (1m), Stats., because it was a transitional provision and is no longer applicable. The bill has no substantive effect and no fiscal effect.
