Good Morning. My name is Ed Steichen. I chair the Madison Urban Ministry task force on Justice Issues. I am acting chair of the Money, Education and Prisons Task Force.

I have debated with myself whether, in this short time this morning, to present a few statistics and make a few modest suggestions. Others will do that. I decided just to let it all hang out. Shipment of prisoners out of state is only one cruel part of a prison system gone berserk.

I was a volunteer in Brazil when it was under military dictatorial rule. I have been involved in Latin American and Central American solidarity movements ever since. Out of that background I read about the Supermax prison in 1997, and it shocked me into awareness of what the Wisconsin legislature is doing to its prison system. I collected a two foot stack of papers from the Legislative reference bureau to see what legislators were thinking when they established that prison. There was not one thing in those papers about the barbaric nature of a supermax prison. The papers were all about economic development, racism and votes. At that point I began looking at the prison system as a whole. And again I found economic development, racism and votes.

Wisconsin is not a high crime state. There is no relationship between the crime rate and the explosion of imprisonment over the past 15 years. There is no relationship between the crime rate and the explosion of crime reporting in the media. There is no relationship between the crime rate and the exploitation of crime for getting votes.

There is a strong relationship between racism and the imprisonment system. 50% of the prisoners are black. 5% of the population is black. There is a strong relation between the racist garbage cranked out by the Bradley foundation and the activity of the Wisconsin legislature. Why doesn't it surprise me that Milwaukee is reported to be the most segregated and the most racist city in the country? Why didn't it surprise me when an African American woman told me that she doesn't know a single black woman who doesn't have a son, a father or a husband in the prison system? Why doesn't it surprise me that the fear engendered by racism is driving the prison system to economic disaster?

But the public is beginning to understand. Read the report just issued by the Catholic bishops. Read the latest newsletter of the Wisconsin conference of churches. We held a conference in February expecting 300 people. Four hundred came. Madison Urban ministry is sponsoring 5 monthly dialogues on prisons. We worried whether people would come. The church hall was packed for the September dialogue. We arranged a panel for the November national meeting of a Catholic lay organization in Milwaukee. The panel is entitled, "The Wisconsin Prison System: Are we approaching ethnic cleansing?" Two hundred and twenty people are signed up.

This is not Alabama. This is not Mississippi.

"Yes! The out of state prisoners should be brought home."

Although I cannot attend today's hearing I am writing to show my support for this bill. What you are proposing takes courage, and simple common sense. Removing people who are incarcerated from ties to their family, friends and loved ones will only increase the chances of reoffense. The supposed cost savings of the transfers is then negated, again, pure common sense.

Perhaps when the policy makers in the legislature and the Dept. of Corrections realize the reason for imprisonment is also to rehabilitate, the public's interest will be honestly served and tax payer dollars will be effectively spent. The public interest will be served when incarceration policies in Wisconsin aim to rehabilitate, not just punish. Punishment without rehabilitation does not work.

Loved ones are only asking for humane treatment of their incarcerated loved ones. Having been to the private prison in Tennessee, I see many problems, here are only a few. Guards seem inept and poorly trained, a lobby guard was dozing off on one visit. Fire alarms go off repeatedly when visiting and no one reacts. What if a real fire broke out? Will it take law suits by loved ones after a catastrophe to get the point across; I pray that doesn't happen. While on a recent visit a guard went into a tirade at a visitor - all the visitor wanted to do was leave early. The prison staff couldn't round up a guard to strip search the inmate, so the visitor had to wait, and were screamed at by the guard in the most unprofessional and scary manner: those visitors were in effect held hostage - this would not happen in Wis. Inmates have no hobby materials or opportunities, recreation is often cancelled for no reason. The food is horrendous, no one is asking the inmates be given caviar - we are asking they be given food that is nutritious with some variety. When these men return to Wis. with more anger, severe health and psychological problems, the supposed cost savings of transfers will be shown to be a hoax.

Prison should not be fun or a cakewalk, but if we truly are a civilized society, it should be compassionate and helping to change not just punish. Prisons have been shown to create criminals, does that make sense and when we face up to that as a society?

Visitors in Tenn. have been turned away after driving from Wis. to Tenn. when the meager visiting room was full. Others were asked to leave when the visiting room was full and new visitors appeared. The huge cost to loved ones just getting to Tn. is cruel, imagine driving 12 hours to see your son, and then be told you can't come in or must go early. Does the legislature and the Dept. of corrections care about corrections? Phone calls to loved ones are excessively high, I pay \$27 for a half hour call to me collect, and often the phone call is cut off early, as it was last Christmas. It is known that family involvement reduces the chance for reoffense, then why is everything possible done to limit family involvement. I ask sincerely, does the legislature and the DOC want rehabilitation?

The Wis prison population is exploding due in part to parole being halted to a trickle. Work release and intensive sanctions with monitoring, things that work and promote genuine change are virtually non-existent. Things that cost less as well. Rehabilitation is not a foreign word, but why do so few legislators and the DOC not understand. Looking tough on crime is one thing, but truly trying to prevent crime and rehabilitate these men would truly be in the public's interest.

The taxpayers of Wis are not saving a penny by transferring prisoners. The increased cost of medical care later and higher chance of reoffense will only add up to a huge bill for the people of Wis, on top of the huge amount of money the DOC is already appropriated. Money spent for what? Bus rides to Tenn.

My thoughts are genuinely tough on crime AND smart on crime.

Warehousing of these people, be it in Wis or elsewhere is a failure; let's fix the problems. The great majority of these inmates sorely want to be contributing members of society, not a burden. They deserve a second chance, yet their fair chance at a second chance is all but eliminated by current policy. No one is saying they don't need punishment, but how about the rehabilitation aspect of imprisonment, what happened to it in Wis.?

I ask that these human beings be brought back to their state, it is the right thing to do, it is the courageous thing to do, and will help protect the citizens of Wisconsin. Isn't that what we want?


