MEMORANDUM

To: Senate Judiciary and Consumer Affairs Committee
From: Linda Barth, Public Affairs Director
Date: May 19, 1999
Re: Assembly Bill 108 and Senate Bill 30

The State Bar's Family Law Section and Children and the Law Section have suggestions regarding Assembly Bill 108 and Senate Bill 30 which prohibits visitation or placement of a child with a parent who has murdered the other parent.

The members of the Sections see circumstances where it may be possible that limiting contact with the convicted parent would be emotionally harmful to the child. Currently, as the bill is written, the burden is on the child—if the child is mature enough—to seek contact with the convicted parent.

We have been working with the bill authors on language that would provide some judicial discretion in these cases. The amendment requires the parent seeking visitation or placement to prove by clear and convincing evidence that the placement or visitation is in the child's best interest and requires the judge to consider the wishes of the child.

It is our hope that you will support the amendment at the public hearing on May 25th. Please feel free to call me at 250-6140, if you have any questions.



AMENDMENTS TO SB 30/AB 108

Senate Amendment 1 to SB 30

- This amendment provides for the “grandfather clause” of the proposal’s main provisions. This would allow for children that have already been forced to visit/speak with their parent to petition the court to remove the visitation order.
- The amendment is offered by you and Senator Lazich

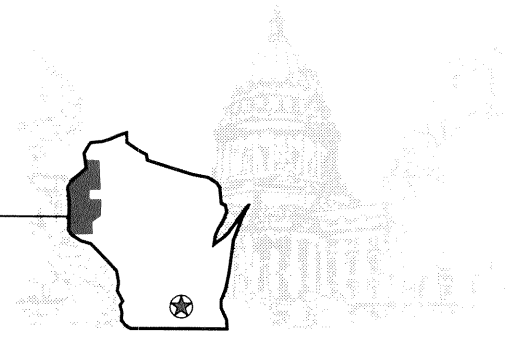

- This is a result of domestic violence groups and the State Bar’s objections to removing all discretion of the Courts to provide for visitation.
- This amendment would allow for the granting of visitation rights only after the convicted parent proves by clear and convincing evidence that there would be some benefit to the child. A judge is also required to take the child’s position on the matter into account for his/her ruling

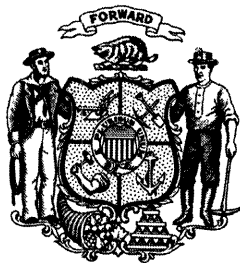

Dear Senator George:

We respectfully request that you schedule a hearing on Assembly Bill 108 (AB 108), as it has been referred to the Senate Judiciary and Consumer Affairs Committee for consideration. AB 108 passed in the Assembly on a 95-0 vote on March 26.

We would like to introduce an amendment to AB 108, per the request of one of our constituents. This amendment prohibits a court from granting visitation or physical placement with a child to a parent or other person who is convicted for solicitation to commit the first-degree intentional homicide of a parent of the child in question.

One of our constituents requested this amendment based on her child custody case. Her husband was convicted of solicitation of murder in the first-degree and is currently in prison. For obvious reasons, this constituent has sued for divorce from her husband. During the child custody hearing, however, the judge did not allow any of the information pertaining to the husband's conviction to be considered in determining custody of their child. The system has understandably frustrated our constituent, who will be forced to allow her child to visit her former husband in prison. A news article about this woman's story is attached for your review.

Our amendment would address her concerns by extending the provisions of AB 108 to cover the conviction for solicitation to commit first-degree murder when courts consider child custody placements. We have enclosed a copy of the amendment for your perusal.

Thank you for considering our request to schedule a hearing on AB 108 so that we may offer our amendment.

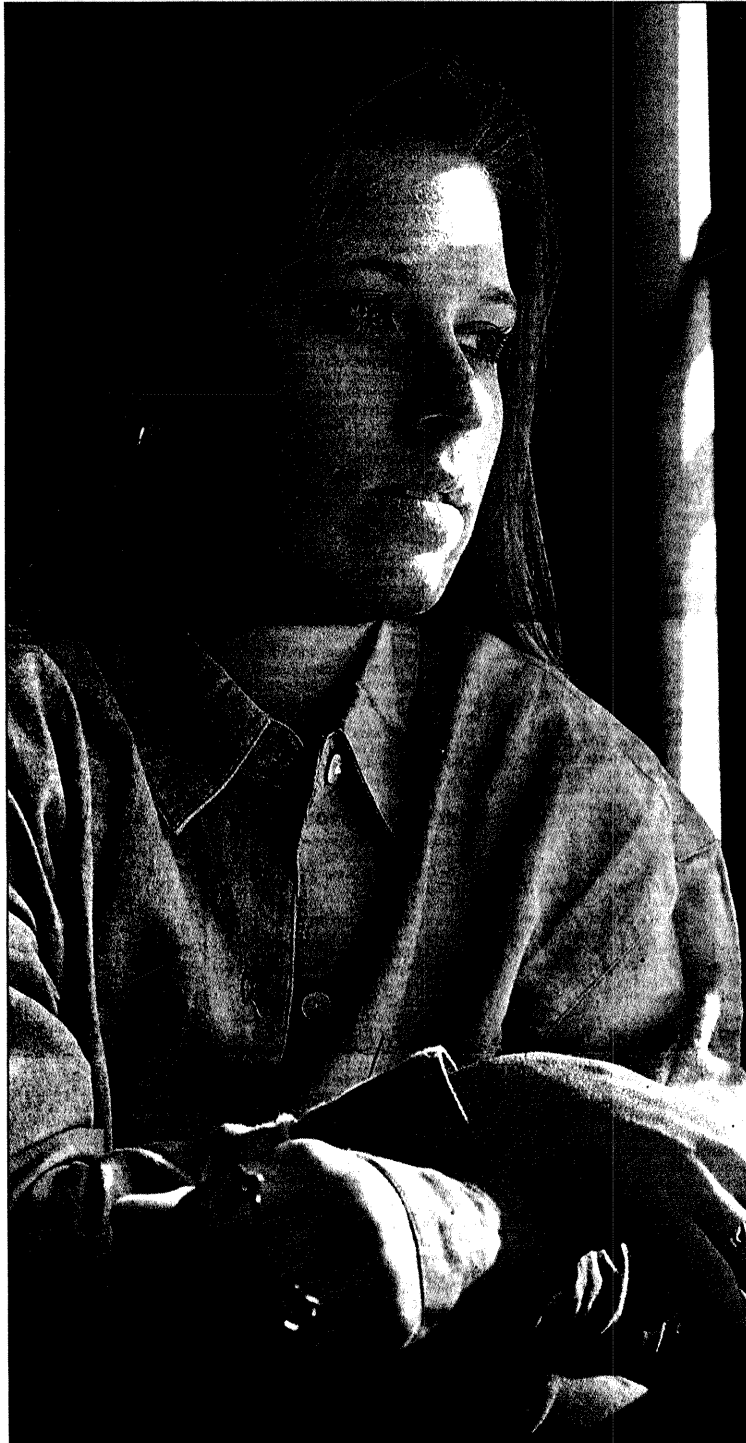

Woman fights father's claim to son



Melanie Wiegand says it's unfair a jury did not know her ex-husband tried to have her killed when it ruled he could keep his parental rights to the

Man tried to have wife killed, but maintains parental rights

Should a man who tried to have his wife killed retain his parental rights?

A St. Croix County jury, prevented from learning of the man's conviction, said yes late last year.

Melanie Wiegand, whose life was spared by police intervention, calls the verdict ridiculous and wants a new trial.

Patrick L. Wolfe, 27, sentenced to 10 years in prison in 1996 for soliciting first-degree intentional homicide, claims he's changed and wants nothing more than to renew a relationship with his now 5-year-old son.

And while the parental rights case is reviewed by the 3rd District Court of Appeals, Wiegand is battling her ex-husband and in-laws in a Pierce County visitation dispute.

"This is a very unusual situation, a very difficult situation for Melanie," said Sue Glasser, a River Falls attorney representing Wiegand. "She has been victimized by Patrick Wolfe for years and wants it to end. The only way that will happen is if his parental rights end, and he is not allowed to see their son."

Wiegand, 25, says she's spent most of the past three years caring for the couple's son, trying to get her life in order and worrying about Wolfe's release from prison.

Wolfe was denied parole in September and is eligible for consideration this summer, according to records at Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution in Plymouth.

"Our son has not seen his father in three years and has no memory of him," said Wiegand, who graduated from St. Croix Central High School in Hammond and met Wolfe while attending the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay in 1993.

"He lied to me from the time I first met him, and he continues to lie," Wiegand said. "He gave his rights away as a father when he tried to have me killed. What did he think would happen to our son if I was dead, and he was in prison?"

"He wasn't thinking of his son then. He only cared about himself and still does."

Wolfe and Wiegand were going through a divorce when Wolfe offered an undercover police officer \$5,000 to kill Wiegand while Wolfe was visiting relatives in April 1996.

Wolfe pleaded no contest in 1996 to the solicitation charge.

"You got caught up in writing your own novel here," St. Croix County Judge Eric Lundell told Wolfe before handing down the maximum sentence.

"The last chapter in this book, though, won't be written until after whatever sentence I come up with here is over with and some period

of time exists where you don't do anything else foolish," Lundell said.

At the sentencing hearing, Wolfe apologized to his son and parents but not Wiegand, who lives in west-central Wisconsin.

Fearing Wolfe's release from prison, Wiegand filed a request last year to terminate Wolfe's parental rights so he would have no reason to see her or their son.

St. Croix County Judge Scott Needham denied repeated requests by Glasser to have the jury hear about Wolfe's conviction on solicitation of murder.

A mistrial was declared in July when a juror learned of the crime and informed other jurors.

A second two-day trial was held in December. But a large portion of Wiegand's testimony was not heard by the second jury, and others who

had testified on Wiegand's behalf did not testify in the second session, Wiegand and Glasser said.

Court records indicate Needham believed the jury would be

tainted by knowledge of the conviction.

He declined to comment on the case.

According to state statutes, evidence of conviction of a crime may be excluded if its "value is substantially outweighed by the danger of unfair prejudice."

"I don't think the law is wrong; the ruling is wrong," Glasser said. "The jury heard Pat Wolfe cite a story that he always wanted to be a good father and see his child, and was always concerned about his son and all that."

"The jury got the picture of Melanie being vindictive, and she had no way to explain why Wolfe couldn't see the child because she couldn't talk about his crime," Glasser said. "That's not fair."

Although there are numerous grounds for involuntary termination of parental rights, the only one available in Wiegand's case was for abandonment.

"If he had been successful, that's automatic termination of rights," Glasser said. "Unfortunately, in Wisconsin, one of the grounds is not solicitation."

"We had to go with abandonment, and then we're not allowed to argue what kind of parent tries to kill the mother and gets up on the stand and says he's always loved his child," Glasser said.

In her statement to the state appellate court Glasser requested a new trial, saying there was sufficient evidence to find that Wolfe

had good cause for failing to visit his son, and that Needham erred in excluding evidence of Wolfe's crime.

"I don't think this is a very interesting case at all," said Kristina O'Boyle, a New Richmond attorney representing Wolfe. "My client's conviction had nothing to do with whether he abandoned his son. It was not a factor that the jury needed to know."

Meanwhile, Pierce County Judge Robert Wing is dealing with a messy visitation situation in which Wolfe is requesting an opportunity to correspond with his son by mail.

Paternal grandparents William and Marie Wolfe of Marinette have periodic visitation of the boy and are concerned that if Patrick Wolfe's visitation rights are terminated, theirs might be severed too.

The Wolfes declined to comment on the case.

Patrick Wolfe did not ask for visitation of his son when the couple's divorce was finalized, so no formal order — either allowing or prohibiting visitation — was on file. Wing also did not place a warning in the file saying Wolfe was in jeopardy of losing visitation rights.

Wing is waiting for experts to predict what effect correspondence or visitation with Wolfe may have on the child before he issues a ruling, court records state.

"This case is interesting in that it's

involved missed it.

"It comes down to what's in the best interest for the child," O'Boyle said. "I think Patrick Wolfe is genuinely concerned about his son and wouldn't do anything to jeopardize that. The mother and child have nothing to fear."

Wolfe, whose request for sentence reconsideration was denied last year by Lundell, said he plans to live with his parents when released. If Wolfe is denied visitation rights, the situation causes a dilemma for Wolfe's parents and the judicial system.

"In my heart I do feel I have been punished sufficiently," Wolfe said in his letter to Lundell in July. "(I'm) going to do the things necessary to show my family, my ex-wife, her family and society that I do care about what I did and am truly sorry."

Wiegand doesn't believe him.

"I don't want to deal with the thought of what he might do to me when he gets out," she said. "It's not my fault he's in prison. I don't know how he can do what he did and retain his rights. It makes no sense."

Rep. Montgomery is introducing an Assembly companion bill, LRB-1844/1, to Sen. Darling's Lizzy's Law. The LRB analysis is included below for your review. If you would like to sign on to this legislation, please contact John in my office at 6-5840 or e-mail him at john.flynn@legis.state.wi.us by Friday, January 29, 1999. You will be added as a cosponsor of the companion bill unless you specify otherwise. No hard copy will be sent to offices.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, in a divorce or legal separation that involves a minor child, the court must award legal custody of the child and allocate to the parents physical placement with the child. The court may not deny a parent physical placement unless the court finds that the physical placement would endanger the child's physical, mental or emotional health. In an action affecting the family, the court may grant visitation with a minor child to a grandparent, stepparent or person who has had a relationship similar to a parent-child relationship with the child if the court determines that the visitation is in the child's best interest. In a guardianship matter that involves a minor child, the court may grant visitation rights to a grandparent or stepparent of the child if one or both of the child's parents are deceased and the court determines that the visitation is in the child's best interest.

This bill prohibits a court from granting visitation or physical placement rights with a child to a parent of the child or to another person if that parent or other person has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of a parent of the child. The prohibition applies in any action affecting the family that involves the child and in any guardianship matter that involves the child. Additionally, on the motion of a party or on its own motion, a court is required to modify an existing physical placement order by denying a parent physical placement with a child if the parent is convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of the child's other parent. In all of these situations, however, the court may grant visitation or physical placement if the child wishes to have visitation or physical placement with the parent or other person and is mature enough to make such a decision and if the visitation or physical placement would be in the best interests of the child.

Under current law, the court assigned to exercise jurisdiction under the children's code and the juvenile justice code (juvenile court) may place a child or a juvenile who is in need of temporary physical custody or who has been adjudged to

be delinquent or in need of protection or services in, among other placements, the home of a parent or other relative of the child or, if the placement is for less than 30 days, the home of a guardian of the child. Also, under current law, if the juvenile court places such a child or juvenile outside of his or her home, the juvenile court may set reasonable rules of parental visitation if the juvenile court finds that parental visitation would be in the best interests of the child. In addition, under current law, the juvenile court may issue a temporary restraining order and injunction prohibiting a parent against whom a petition for involuntary termination of parental rights (TPR) has been filed from visitation or contact with the child and may order or prohibit visitation by a birth parent of a child who has been placed in sustaining care following a TPR. Finally, under current law, the juvenile court may grant reasonable visitation rights to a relative, for example, a grandparent, who has maintained a relationship similar to a parent-child relationship with a child who has been adopted by a stepparent or relative.

This bill prohibits a juvenile court from placing a child or a juvenile who is in need of temporary physical custody or who has been adjudged to be delinquent or in need of protection or services in the home of a parent, other relative of the child if the parent, other relative or guardian has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of a parent of the child. The bill also prohibits the juvenile court from granting visitation to a parent of such a child or juvenile if the parent has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of the child's other parent. In addition, the bill requires the juvenile court, on petition, to issue a temporary restraining order and injunction prohibiting a parent against whom a petition for involuntary TPR has been filed from visitation or contact with the child if the parent has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of the child's other parent. Similarly, the bill prohibits the

juvenile court from granting visitation to a birth parent of a child who has been placed in sustaining care following a TPR if the birth parent has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of the child's other birth parent. Finally, the bill prohibits the juvenile court from granting visitation rights to a relative who has maintained a relationship similar to a parent-child relationship with a child if the relative has been convicted of first-degree or second-degree intentional homicide of a parent of the child. In all of these situations, however, the juvenile court may grant the visitation or placement if the child or juvenile wishes to have the visitation or placement and is mature enough to make such a decision and if the visitation or placement would be in the best interests of the child or juvenile.

The Family Law Section is concerned that there may be some circumstances where AB-108 would be harmful to that subset of children who have a need to continue contact with their surviving parent. Therefore, we make the following proposal: The prohibition on placement, which appears throughout Engrossed Assembly Bill 108, should be replaced with the following presumption:

The court shall presume that ordering placement with a parent or custodian who has murdered the child's parent would endanger the child's mental or emotional health unless the parent seeking placement shows by clear and convincing evidence to the contrary.



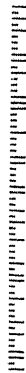
