SUBJECT: AB 640, relating to placement of Equal Rights programs in the statutes

Thank you for the opportunity to speak with you about the need for revision in the placement of Equal Rights statutes related to housing and public accommodations.

First, a bit of history as to how this problem developed may be helpful. The statutes relating to Open Housing and Public Accommodations were transferred from Chapter 101 to Chapter 106 when the Department of Commerce was created in 1997. Chapter 101 now relates entirely to programs administered by the Department of Commerce. When the housing and public accommodations programs were placed in Chapter 106, its title was not changed from the existing title: Apprenticeship and Employment Programs.

This title of course makes it difficult for housing providers, providers of public accommodations and seekers of those services to locate the programs in the statutes.

The proposed revision provides a new title for Chapter 106: Equal Rights, Apprenticeship and Employment Programs and renumbers and recreates separate subchapters entitled Open Housing and Public places of accommodation or amusement.

This proposal makes no substantive changes in the statutes. Its purpose is to eliminate confusion by correcting the placement and numbering of these programs. We respectfully request your support.
