Thanks for your response. I will go ahead and prepare the draft based on AB-201 unless I hear differently from you. I'll also note, below, what AB-201, AB-202, and AB-240 do, just to verify that AB-201 is the right bill to base the amendment on.

AB-201: requires traffic accident reports to include information on whether cell phone use contributed to causing the accident.

AB-202: prohibits a person holding a probationary license (typically teenagers who are first getting their driver's license) from using a cell phone while operating a vehicle, except to report an emergency.

AB-240: prohibits any driver from using a cell phone while operating a vehicle, except to report an emergency and except for hands-free cell phones.

Again, I will proceed with the draft based on AB-201 unless I hear differently from you today. Thank you. Aaron

March 22, 2001 - Introduced by Representatives Colon, Boyle, Carpenter, BERGEAU and CULLEN Referred to Committee on Highway Safety.

AN ACT to amend 346.95 (2); and to create 346.895 of the statutes; relating to:

operating a motor vehicle while using a cellular or other mobile telephone and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law prohibits inattentive driving, which means that a driver of a motor vehicle may not be so engaged or occupied as to interfere with the safe driving of the vehicle. Any person convicted of inattentive driving may be required to forfeit not less than \$20 nor more than \$400.

This bill generally prohibits a person from operating a motor vehicle (other than an authorized emergency vehicle) while using a cellular or other mobile telephone (cellular phone), regardless of whether use of the cellular phone interferes with the operation of the vehicle. However, an operator may use a hands-free cellular phone and may use a cellular phone to report an emergency. Any person convicted of operating a motor vehicle while using a cellular phone may be required to forfeit not less than \$20 por more than \$400.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 346.895 of the statutes is created to read:

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ASSEMBLY BILL 240

346.895 Use of cellular telephone. No person may operate a motor vehicle,
other than an authorized emergency vehicle, while using a cellular or other mobile
telephone unless one of the following applies:

- (1) The operator of a motor vehicle may use a cellular or other mobile telephone to report an emergency.
- (2) The operator of a motor vehicle equipped with a cellular or other mobile telephone device that allows the operator to talk and listen without holding the telephone or its handset or receiver may utilize this device if the operator does not hold or touch the telephone or its handset or receiver while operating the motor vehicle except to enable the device, enter a telephone number, or hang up or turn off the telephone.
- SECTION 346.95 (2) of the statutes is amended to read: (12)
 - 346.95 (2) Any person violating s. 346.89 (1), 346.895, or 346.94 (2), (4), or (7) may be required to forfeit not less than \$20 nor more than \$400.

SECTION 8. Effective date:

(1) takes effect on the first day of the 4th month beginning after publication.
