Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

Under current law, a volunteer fire fighter, emergency medical technician or first responder in a municipality whose compensation does not exceed \$2,500 may hold elective office in that municipality. The bill increases the compensation limit to \$15,000.

The bill has two effects, only one of which has a fiscal effect. If a municipality increases the compensation of volunteer fire fighters, emergency medical technicians or first responders above \$2,500 and a current elected officer of the municipality is also a volunteer fire fighter, emergency medical technician or first responder, municipal costs would increase. Although data are not available to estimate the number of municipalities or elected officers that would be affected, costs of the bill are likely to be minimal.

To the extent the bill increases the compensation limit, it enables volunteer fire fighters, emergency medical technicians and first responders who currently earn up to \$15,000 to serve as elected officers. This enlargement of the pool of potential elected officers has no fiscal effect.
