The Bureau of State Risk Management records show that over the last 5 years 31 wrongful death claims have been filed against the state of which 14 are for medical malpractice. The remainder include general, professional, and auto liability. Of these, 6 have incurred or likely will incur payments by the state. The total paid and reserve amounts for these 6 claims total \$1,740,000. This amount exceeds \$250,000 per claim as more than one officer, employee or agent can be named in each suit with each subject to the \$250,000 maximum per claim. The increased limits could increase state costs by \$100,000 to \$200,000 per year.
