## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill concerns invasions of privacy. There are two portions of the proposed legislation that are pertinent to the University System.

The legislation provides that if, on or after January 1, 2007, a new record is created containing social security account number, along with information revealing the identify of an individual, the number must be deleted prior to permitting public access to that record. Under current law, the University of Wisconsin System is already prohibited from assigning to any student an identification number that is identical to or incorporates the student's social security number. Thus this proposal will not have a fiscal effect on our institutions.

In addition, this legislation would require that each institution and two year collegiate campus of the University of Wisconsin System athletic team that his its home field or arena in this state to adopt a written policy on who may enter and remain in the locker room used by the school or team to interview or seek information from any person. This will not have a fiscal effect on our institutions.
