Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill relates to interfering with the custody of a child and providing a penalty. It provides that an individual who interferes with the custody of a child by withholding him/her for more than six hours is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor and may be fined up to \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than nine months or both.

There would be a local fiscal impact if an individual was convicted of such an offense and sentenced to a county jail. Sentences of less than 1 year must be to a county jail.

There would be a state fiscal impact if an individual was convicted of such an offense and he/she were placed on probation. The average cost to supervise an offender on probation was \$1,610 in FY 2000.

However, calculating a fiscal estimate for this bill is not possible due to the uncertainty of the number of offenders who would be charged with this violation.
