Prohibit dispensing of prescription birth control in school-based health clinics							

## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill prohibits the dispensing, prescribing, or administering of a contraceptive prescription drug or device to a pupil, as part of a school-based medical service, by an employee of, volunteer for, or contractor with a school district, a cooperative educational service agency, a charter school, a private school, the Wisconsin School for the Deaf (WSD), or the Wisconsin Center for the Visually Impaired (WCBVI). The bill also prohibits state agencies and local governmental units from authorizing state, local, or federal funds for school-based medical services to an entity that violates the prohibition on dispensing, prescribing, or administering the contraceptives. Entities that violate the prohibition may not receive additional funds for the school-based medical services for 24 months and must return all monies paid for the services, and the grant, subsidy, or other funding under which the funds were received is terminated.

#### State fiscal effect:

This bill has no fiscal effect on the Department of Public Instruction.

### Local fiscal effect:

In FY00, school districts statewide, including WSD and WCRVI, reported revenues of \$16,150,000 from the School-Based Services program administered by the Department of Health and Family Services. If this bill had been in effect in FY00 and any of the districts that received these funds had administered a contraceptive to a pupil, the amount of assistance to local districts from the School-Based Services program would have been reduced.

Also in FY00, school districts, including WSD and WCBVI, were reimbursed \$11,700,000 for therapy services to children with disabilities from the state's special education appropriation. Districts received \$3,184,300 in federal IDEA funds for nursing and therapy services. These funds would also be reduced under the provisions of this bill. Because it is unknown how many districts would violate the prohibition of dispensing contraceptives to pupils should this bill become law, the local fiscal effect of the bill is indeterminate.
