## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill would require group and individual health insurance plans, including defined network plans, health insurance plans offered by the state, and self funded health insurance plans of cities, villages and counties to provide coverage of smoking cessation treatment. Preferred provider plans, limited service health organizations and disability insurance policies that only cover specified diseases are exempted from this bill.

OCI regularly reviews policy forms to ensure they comply with all state laws. OCI does not directly administer insurance plans to state employees and anticipates no direct impact to the agency.

OCI does not have information on the level of coverage for smoking cessation treatment for self-funded local government health plans. The Department of Employee Trust Funds added a limited smoking cessation benefit, effective 1/1/01 to Uniform Benefits, the benefit package offered by all participating HMOs, as well as the Standard Plan II, SMP and Medicare Plus \$100,000. According to the estimates of the Group Insurance Board's actuary, the benefit will cost \$.24 per member per month. Local government health plans could expect similar cost increases.
