Teacher licensure requirements imposed on school boards; repeal of peer review and mentoring grant program								

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits the department of public instruction (DPI) from imposing initial educator requirements on school boards. The bill also repeals the peer review and mentoring program.

State fiscal effect:

This bill repeals the peer review and mentoring program, currently funded at \$500,000 annually. The elimination of this \$500,000 categorical aid program would require the state to increase general school aids by about \$166,500 (1/3 X \$500,000) in order to maintain the state's two-thirds funding committment.

Local fiscal effect:

Because the administrative rules (ch. PI 34, Wis. Admin. Code) to implement new initial educator requirements do not take effect until 2004, there is no present fiscal effect resulting from the bill's provision that prohibits DPI from imposing these requirements on school boards. The department has assumed that local districts will incur costs to implement the initial educator license. These costs will vary from district to district, depending on the number of initial educators hired in each district. This bill may reduce future costs to school districts. However, because it is unknown how may school boards may choose to mentor, review, orient, or instruct initial educators, this cost reduction is indeterminate.

The repeal of the peer review and mentoring program would preclude districts statewide from applying for grants that total \$500,000 annually.

The increase in general school aids would require school districts statewide to decrease local school property taxes by about \$166,500.
