Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 754 requires electric utilities and cooperative associations to remedy problems associated with their plant or equipment that result in an objectionable flow of current at the premises of a customer or member. It also creates an Electric Pollution Board to award reimbursement grants to electric utilities and cooperative associations that remedy such problems.

AB 754 also creates 20.505 (4)(s), an annual segregated appropriation called the Electric Pollution Fund. The fund consists of a one-twentieth of a cent per kilowatt hour surcharge that electric utilities and cooperative associations must assess on customer and member bills. The Department of Administration's Division of Energy estimates that based on electricity sales in 2000 of 64,689 million kWh, this surcharge will generate \$32,344,500 for the fund with an average 3.0% increase per year. AB 754 appropriates \$27,529,000 to 20.505 (4)(s) in FY03. This appropriation only funds grants awarded by the Electric Pollution Board.

Technical note: Under the bill, there is no provision of funds for any of the Board's administrative expenses. The Board is altached to the Department of Administration for staff services. However, no dollars are identified for providing these services and there is no authority within the department's existing funding sources to expend administrative dollars for this segregated program activity.
