Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

There will be approximately 2,000 persons licensed if the bill passes.

DRL will need to establish a new council, develop administrative rules, design an application, coordinate agendas and meeting of the council, set examination criteria and review approximately 2000 initial credential holders applications.

A search of the web has not turned up any national roofing contractor examinations available to be used. The proposed law calls for an exam that tests competency to perform roofing contracting services, plus knowledge of lien laws and safety requirements. For purposes of the estimate, the goal is a 100 question exam. There may be 2000 candidates the first year. Perhaps 200 per year thereafter.

The bill also authorizes the Department to investigate complaints, conduct hearings and take disciplinary action against persons who violate the laws relating to roofing contractors. The regulation of roofing contractors will lead to approximately 6% of the credential holders having complaints filed against them during the year. Accordingly, it is estimated that 2,000 credential holders will mean that approximately 120 complaints a year $(2,000 \times 6\%)$ will be filed with the Department.

Approximately one-half, or 60 complaints, of the 120 anticipated complaints involving roofing contractors a year will be opened for investigation.

Staffing estimated to accomplish these activities would include: 1FTE PA3, 1FTE Clerical Asst., 1 FTE Consumer Protection investigator, 1 FTE Attorney, .5 FTE Paralegal, and .25 FTE Exam Specialist.
