### Subject

Absentee voting and voter registration at satellite stations; voting by felons; study of voter registration and milti-lingual voting needs; uniform polling hours; service as an election official

#### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This legislation makes several changes concerning election administration. It is difficult to determine the actual fiscal impact on state and local government.

The Elections Board lacks the personnel resources to conduct the proposed study on voter registration. The agency would have to contract with a consultant to identify the costs and benefits of implementing a statewide voter registration list that addresses the issues identified in the bill. In 2000-01, the Elections Board spent approximately \$85,000 to develop a study that focused on the agency's information management system. The proposed statewide voter registration system would be an independent IT project with a more limited scope. However a statewide voter registration list would require interfacing with the 72 counties and 1,850 municipalities. Based on previous agency experience, the cost to hire a contractor to assist the agency in developing an RFI would range between \$50,000 and \$75,000. The agency staff has contacted its current contractor to get a ballpark figure to develop the RFI.

Local governments would incur additional costs of between \$50 and \$250 per day to staff satellite absentee voting locations. The municipality may also incur costs for renting the locations. Current law permits absentee voting in the municipal clerk's officer under the same provisions set out in the legislation. It is assumed that satellite locations would only be used in larger municipalities where locations other than the clerk's office may provide better service to absentee voters.

Establishing a uniform time for opening polling places will add as much as two hours of compensation that small municipalities will have to pay poll workers. There are no figures available on the amount that local governing bodies pay poll workers. It can be assumed that poll workers receive minimum wage. There are no figures available on how many jurisdictions presently open later than 7:00 a.m.

The Elections Board will incur one-time costs for revising, preparing, printing and distributing forms, information materials, manuals and training materials.
