Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This proposal classifies employees of the Department of Corrections (DOC) who are employed at a state prison or a secured correctional facility as protective occupation participants for the purposes of the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS). State correctional officers and probation and parole agents are already classified as protective occupation participants under current law.

In calculating the fiscal estimate for this bill, salary estimates for non-security staff in existing DOC institutions were derived from the personnel management information system (PMIS). The non-security staff salary estimates were then multiplied by the fringe benefit add-on for protective occupation participants (3.3%). It is estimated that a total of 2,726 employees would be affected by the provisions of this bill.

GPR Required = \$2,657,000

Salary \$80,514,200 * 3.3%

PRO/PRS/SEG Required = \$860,700

Salary \$26,081,600 * 3.3%

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The cost of this proposal will continue to increase as DOC opens new institutions and adds employees.
