Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Shorter advance notice could potentially result in higher SPD costs for expert witnesses if defense attorney has less time before court hearing to review records and locate an available expert. However, this potential increase is speculative, and courts could grant adjournments on a case-by-case basis to address this issue.
