Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

ASSUMPTIONS:

- * The two islands being impacted are Madeline and Washington.
- * Bicycles that are already registered in other places will not be re-registered on these islands.
- * Rental bikes (rented from vendors on the islands) are already registered and cannot be constantly reregistered upon every new person renting the bike.
- * Bicycle use is high during the Summer and early Fall (mid-May through mid-October). According to cursory ferry information, it is estimated that between 10,000 and 18,000 bicycles are transported to these islands annually. However, many of these bicycles are with people making return visits to the islands (summer residents of the islands) or have already been registered in another municipality. Bicycles may also be stored year-round and used during the summer months by people maintaining vacation homes on these islands. This number is liberally estimated to be 2,000 and is based on the summer population of the islands.
- * Bike use, thus registration, among non-residents will be very, very slow during November through April.
- * Bicycle registration will be annual and fees will not exceed \$2 per year (a reasonably high per annum charge for bicycle registration based on other fees being assessed by communities in Wisconsin).

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

POTENTIAL IMPACTS:

- * Even with optimistically high non-resident bicycle registration compliance, local revenue from bicycle registration is estimated to be less than \$25,000 for both islands. This assumes the above and further assumes that bicycle use will hold steady despite the additional fees. Additional costs (administration, but perhaps enforcement too) to annually implement such a registration program (especially if new part-time personnel is hired) may very well come close to or exceed revenue intake.
- * Requiring visitor bicycle registration could reduce bicycle use on the islands, especially among families that would need to register multiple bikes, perhaps in addition to being charged ferry fees for transporting their bicycles to the islands. Depending on the registration fee, this could have a small effect on bicycle tourism especially among those families who may be considering one day bicycle trips to the islands.
