Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill authorizes the department, through its Equal Rights Division, to award compensatory and punitive damages in some of the employment discrimination cases handled by the division. There is a cost to the department when legislation involves an expected increase in workload sufficiently large enough to require increased staff. The division currently finds a violation in an average of one or two cases per year that would be eligible for damages under this bill. Adding this additional responsibility to the workload of the division administrative law judges would not result in significantly increased costs, although some hearings may be longer and more complex.

This bill also creates an appropriation to the division of 10% of any damages awarded. It is anticipated that this would result in approximately \$5,000 per year in increased revenue.

SB232 also requires the department to appoint a committee to study wage disparities between men and women and between minority group members and non-minority group members and to recommed solutions and policy alternatives. There is no current data source that is comprehensive enough to provide the necessary information for this review and analysis, therefore, the department anticipates having to develop a survey instrument to collect the necessary data. In addition, the department's labor market information and related staff are federally-funded, and this survey is outside the scope of allowable activities for this staff. Therefore, project staff would need to be hired.

The department would incur approximately \$508,700 in one time costs during the 16 months the bill requires a committee to study the wage disparity issue. This includes \$352,700 for one project staff for one year to staff and coordinate committee activities and an additional four project staff for 18 months to design, conduct and analyze the survey data, \$150,000 for the survey itself and \$6,600 in travel and related expenses for the committee members. In addition, a one-time cost of approximately \$2,000 is estimated for the reprinting of informational materials for the Equal Rights Division.

Local governments could incur increased costs if they were found in violation of the law for one of the bases where damages are allowed.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Passage of this legislation may result in a long-term increase in complaints filed with the Equal Rights Division that could result in the need for additional staff. In addition, if the survey is to be ongoing, rather than one-time, those staff and survey costs identified under the "Assumptions Used In Arriving At Fiscal Estimate" section will be permanent.
