Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Because the bill would create mandatory minimum sentences, SPD costs are likely to increase as a result of increased attorney time on the cases in question. The cases are more likely to include one or more of the following hearings: "reverse-waiver" (hearing on defense request to remand case to juvenile court, trial, contested sentencing. The mandatory 2-year term of improsonment would make negotiations more difficult, thus making the contested hearings more frequent.

The bill may also increase county costs for pretrial incarceration.
