Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

Under current law, the department of natural resources (DNR) issues two types of bear hunting licenses. A Class A bear hunting license allows the license holder to shoot and kill bear. A Class B license allows the holder to assist a Class A license holder in pursuing and baiting bear, and training dogs to pursue bear, but it does not allow the license holder to actually shoot at or kill bear.

Under current law, DNR administers a cumulative preference system for issuing Class A bear licenses if the number of applicants for the license exceeds the number of licenses available. Under the system, an applicant may apply for a license or may apply for only a preference point if he or she is not seeking a license for the upcoming bear hunting season. DNR gives a preference point to each person who applies for a license but who is not selected. The more preference points an applicant has, the higher priority he or she is given in issuing the licenses. Under current law, an applicant seeking these preference points need not be eligible to receive a hunting license.

This bill requires that an applicant seeking these preference points must be at least 12 years old on the first day of the upcoming bear hunting season and be eligible for a hunting license on that date. It will prevent individuals who are not eligible to hold hunting licenses from accumulating preference points.

Fiscal Estimate:

The 12-year-old provision of this bill clarifies the law and is consistent with the DNR's current practice of handling applications from 11-year-olds on an exception basis. However, because current law does not contain the 12-year-old provision, the DNR has not built this provision into its Automated License Issuance System (ALIS). Minor programming changes are needed to implement the 12-year-old provision in the ALIS system.

It would cost approximately \$5,000 in one-time programming charges to modify ALIS to implement the eligibility provisions of this bill and to check the applicant's birth date against the season opening date.
