2001 SB 70 requires law enforcement officers to forward a copy of the traffic citation and/or a copy of the accident report to the federal department of state if a foreign diplomat is involved. The bill also requires law enforcement officers to verify the status of the person claiming diplomatic status.

SB 70 requires the law enforcement agencies to report to the federal department of the state. Therefore, administrative procedures, including the charging of fees for copies, could be avoided. Law enforcement officers would need to be trained on the law and how to contact the federal department of state regarding a motorists apparent diplomatic status, but this could be done during routine in-services.

There is no fiscal effect on the state with the enactment of 2001 SB 70. There will be few cases where law enforcement officers need to enforce this law. When necessary, any administrative costs would be absorbed in routine services. There are also no local government costs with SB 70.
