Participation in the programming of a youth report center as a condition of a juvenile disposition, sanction, deferred prosecution agreement, or consent decree

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would give courts the option of using participation in a youth report center as a juvenile disposition, sanction, deferred prosecution agreement, or consent decree. Many counties in Wisconsin already operate some form of juvenile report center, but this bill would permit juvenile courts to request or require youth to attend report centers.

Since many counties already operate juvenile report centers, this bill should have little financial impact on those counties. Local governments may also incur additional costs if this bill resulted in courts sending more juveniles to report centers. If a county currently does not operate a report center and, as a result of this legislation, the courts choose to request or require a juvenile in that county to attend a report center, this bill would have a fiscal impact on those counties.

It is not possible to determine whether any of these circumstances will occur, therefore it is not possible to estimate how much this bill may increase local government costs.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
