As required in Sections 227.485(9) and 814.245(10) of the Wis. Stats., I am submitting the report concerning decisions

and resulting payments of attorney fees and related legal costs. Attorney fees and other legal costs are to be paid whenever the opposing party to an agency's Chapter 227 hearing prevails and it is determined the agency's position was not substantially justified.
