EXECUTIVE ORDER #19

Relating to Executive Order No. 6

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 6 created the Governor's committee on Judicial Selection; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Governor under the Constitution and laws of the State of Wisconsin to appoint persons to fill vacancies in the courts until a successor is elected to such office as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to establish a procedure through which vacant judicial offices will be filled by appointment of competent, public-minded lawyers of the highest integrity;

NOW, THEREFORE, I SCOTT McCALLUM, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 14.019 of Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby provide:

1. That in the event that there are less than five (5) applications for a judicial opening the committee will interview the applicants and send no more tahn two (2) to the Governor for selection.
