EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 50

An Amendment Relating to the Governor's Pardon Advisory Board (Executive Order No. 24)

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 6 of the Wisconsin Constitution vests in the Governor the exclusive and discretionary power to grant pardons, commutations and reprieves; and

WHEREAS, it is advantageous to the clemency applicants, the public and the Governor to have an informed review of each application for clemency; and

WHEREAS, such an informed review may ably be performed by a board of advisors; and

WHEREAS, all concerned will benefit from a uniform application process;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SCOTT McCALLUM, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this state, and specifically by Section 14.019 of the Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby:

1. Amend Executive Order No. 24 to provide that the Governor's Pardon Advisory Board shall consist of no more than seven members who serve a term of one year at the pleasure of the Governor and one permanent reserve member.
