NR 20 and 26, Wis. Adm. Code Sport fishing on the inland, outlying and boundary waters and fish refuges on the inland waters of Wisconsin

Statement of Need it was sort as for most payer our as note and integrate impartment of

The following proposed rules were recommended by field and central office staff and were reviewed by the Department and the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission. The numbers by each proposed change are the vote tallies from the spring fish and game hearings held statewide.

- 1. Prohibit the use or possession of artificial lights to shine any waters open to sturgeon spearing during the period from 48 hours before and continuing through the open sturgeon spearing season (4,452 868).
- 2. Prohibit the use of ice holes larger than 48 square feet for sturgeon spearing (5,327 406).
- Winnebago system (4,079 564) and prohibit the sale of both channel and flathead catfish from the Fox River downstream from Lake Winnebago to the DePere dam (4,075 515).
- 4. Establish a daily bag limit of 2 (3,496 1,001) and a possession limit of 10 (3,293 923) for flathead catfish on the Lake Winnebago system, whether taken on hook and line, set or bank poles, or setlines, for 10 years.
- 5. Establish a protected slot limit from 20" to 28", with only 1 > 28" for walleye, sauger and hybrids on the Wisconsin River from the Prairie du Sac dam, Columbia and Sauk Counties, upstream to the Grandfather dam, Lincoln County and on the Yellow River upstream to the dam in Dexterville, Wood County and the Lemonwier river, for 5 years (4,505 788).
- 6. Increase the minimum length limit for walleye from 15" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on the lower Wisconsin River from the Prairie du Sac dam in Columbia and Sauk Counties downstream to its mouth (3,045 1,994).

The following proposals of primarily local interest, which were supported based on local, statewide and regional summaries, respectively, of the voting, are also contained in the attached rule order:

- 1. Create a seasonal fish refuge from March 1 through May 15 on the Yellow River from the dam in Cadott downstream to the Main Street bridge in Cadott, Chippewa County (78 73).
- 2. Reduce the minimum length limit for muskellunge from 34" to 28" on Owl Lake, Iron County (15 2).

- 3. Establish catch-and-release only for brook trout on Graveyard Creek, Iron County for 10 years (10 3).
- 4. Establish catch-and-release only for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Yellowstone River upstream from CTH F, Lafayette County for 10 years (56 0).
 - 5. Eliminate the minimum length limit for bass on McGee Lake, Langlade County (77 0).
- 6. Establish a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Post Lake (upper and lower), Langlade County (47 9).
- 7. Establish a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Pike Lake, Marathon County (78 7).
- 8. Increase the minimum length for muskellunge from 34" to 40" on Buckskin Lake, Oneida County (68 9).
- 9. Establish a 15" minimum length limit and daily bag limit of 5 for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Hat Rapids Flowage, Oneida County, and eliminate the restriction on taking only 1 over 14" (82 1).
- 10. Increase the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Maple Lake, Oneida County (71 2).
- 11. Authorize the harvest of 1 largemouth or smallmouth bass < 14" on Big Round Lake and Balsam Lake, Polk County for 10 years (78 1).
- 12. Increase the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Wisconsin River from Stevens Point Flowage dam to Al-Tech Park Spillway, Portage County (204 0).
- 13. Increase the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass and establish a 32" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 1 for northern pike on Jacqueline Lake, Portage County (184 1).
- 14. Establish a daily bag limit of 10 for bluegill on Chetac and Birch Lakes, Sawyer and Washburn Counties (83 3; 51 1, respectively).
- 15. Increase the minimum length limit from 15" to 28" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Sand Lake, Sawyer County (82 2).
- 16. Increase the daily bag limit for trout from 1 to 3, reduce the minimum length limit from 16" to 12" for brown and rainbow trout and from 16" to 8" for brook trout, and eliminate the requirement for artificial lures on the Willow River downstream from Willow Falls including Little Falls Lake and Lake Mallalieu and Race Branch, St. Croix County (58 0).
- 17. Establish restrictive harvest regulations for largemouth and smallmouth bass, muskellunge and walleye on Sparkling Lake, Vilas County for 7 years (29 8).
- 18. Increase the minimum length for muskellunge from 34" to 45" on Little Saint Germain Lake, Vilas County, for 10 years (60 0).

19. Establish Millpond Park Pond, Walworth County, as an urban fishing water (65 - 5).

Modifications in Response to Public Hearing Comments

The following proposals were modified in response to public comment and are recommended for adoption, as amended:

- 1. Extend the year around Create a seasonal fish refuge on the Chippewa River below the Jim Falls Dam from a point 1,000 feet below the dam to the old CTH Y Bridge and create a seasonal fish refuge downstream to the new CTH Y Bridge, Chippewa County, from the last Sunday in August to the first Saturday in May first Saturday in September to October 15 on the Chippewa River from the old CTH Y Bridge downstream to the new CTH Y Bridge, Chippewa County (Chippewa County vote on the two original proposals: 18 139 and 21 127). We recommend combining the two proposed refuges into one area and establishing a uniform seasonal fish refuge only during the hook and line sturgeon fishing season to address concerns with over-harvest of sturgeon and also to address comments that the extended nature of the refuges in the original proposals would unduly restrict legitimate fishing opportunities within the affected area during other times of the year.
- 2. Increase the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Beaver Dam Lake, Dodge County for 5 years (77-105; NOT supported in Dodge County, but the Department recommends advancing this proposal as modified to include a 5 year sunset).

The following proposal was dropped from further consideration based on lack of substantial public support at the hearings:

1. Increase the minimum length limit from 15" to 28" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Black Dan, Island, and Winter Lakes, Sawyer County (22 – 43).

In addition, the Natural Resources Board made the following changes:

- 1. Section 19 The 10-year sunset on the catch and release regulations for largemouth and smallmouth bass from the Yellowstone River, Lafayette County, is reduced to a 5-year sunset to accommodate public comments and concerns raised at the hearing related to confusion over the duration of the sunset.
- 2. Section 53 Adoption of the fish refuge on the Yellow River is deferred to accommodate the development of a citizen-initiated "sturgeon guard" to address public comments at the hearing related to the loss of shore fishing opportunities for kids in the spring. The rule is modified to allow the Department to put the fish refuge into effect without additional hearings at any time simply by posting if the sturgeon guard is not effective at deterring the ongoing harassment of spawning sturgeon in the area. Conversely, the refuge will not be in effect if it is not posted.
- 3. Change the effective date of section 2 (sturgeon spearing rules) to be December 31, 2001 to include the upcoming season in February 2002.

Appearances at the Public Hearings and Their Position

Public hearings were held in all 72 counties on April 9, 2001. The vote on each proposed change in indicated above where each proposed change is described.

Section 1 establishes a possession limit of 10 for flathead catfish on the Lake Winnebago system for 10 years.

Section 2 prohibits the use or possession of artificial lights to shine any waters open to sturgeon spearing during the period from 48 hours before and continuing through the open sturgeon spearing season and prohibits the use of ice holes larger than 48 square feet for sturgeon spearing.

Section 3 prohibits the sale of flathead catfish taken by set or bank poles and setlines from the Lake Winnebago system and prohibits the sale of both channel and flathead catfish from the Fox river downstream from Lake Winnebago to the DePere dam.

Sections 4, 6, 7, 18, 22, 23, 25, 25m, 34, 35, 37, 38 and 49 establish a protected slot limit from 20" to 28", with only 1 > 28" for walleye, sauger and hybrids on the Wisconsin river from the Prairie du Sac dam, Columbia and Sauk counties, upstream to the Grandfather dam, Lincoln county and on the Yellow River upstream to the dam in Dexterville, Wood county and the Lemonwier river, for 5 years, when it reverts back to a 15" minimum length limit.

Sections 5, 50 and 51 establish a daily bag limit of 2 for flathead catfish on the Lake Winnebago system whether taken on hook and line, set or bank poles, or setlines for 10 years, when it reverts back to twice the daily bag limit.

Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 36 and 39 increase the minimum length limit for walleye from 15" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and

hybrids on the lower Wisconsin river from the Prairie du Sac dam, located in Columbia and Sauk counties, downstream to its mouth.

Section 11m increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Beaver Dam lake, Dodge county for 5 years.

Section 15 reduces the minimum length limit for muskellunge from 34" to 28" on Owl lake, Iron county.

Sections 16 and 17 establish catch-and-release only for brook trout on Graveyard creek, Iron county for 10 years.

Section 19 establishes catch-and-release only for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Yellowstone river upstream from CTH F, Lafayette county for 5 years, when it reverts back to a 14" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 5.

Section 20 eliminates the minimum length limit for bass on McGee lake, Langlade county.

Section 21 establishes a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Post lake (upper and lower), Langlade county.

Section 24 establishes a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Pike lake, Marathon county.

Section 26 increases the minimum length for muskellunge from 34" to 40" on Buckskin lake, Oneida county.

Section 27 rearranges the waters listed under special walleye regulations by lake chains, rather than listing the waters individually, and includes "connecting" waters between the listed lakes. This section also omits Hat Rapids flowage from the list of waters under this special walleye regulation for consistency with other connected waters;

Section 28 increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Maple lake, Oneida county.

Section 29 authorizes the harvest of 1 largemouth or smallmouth bass < 14" on Big Round lake and Balsam lake, Polk county for 10 years, when it reverts back to a 14" minimum length limit.

Section 30 increases the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Wisconsin river from Stevens Point flowage dam to Al-Tech Park spillway, Portage county.

Sections 31 and 32 increase the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass on Jacqueline lake, Portage county.

Section 35 establishes a 32" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 1 for northern pike on Jacqueline lake, Portage county.

Sections 40 and 48 establish a daily bag limit of 10 for bluegill on Chetac and Birch lakes, Sawyer and Washburn counties.

Section 41 increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 28" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Sand lake, Sawyer county.

Section 42 increases the daily bag limit for trout from 1 to 3, reduces the minimum length limit from 16" to 12" for brown and rainbow trout and from 16" to 8" for brook trout, and eliminates the requirement for artificial lures on the Willow river downstream from Willow falls including Little Falls lake and Lake Mallalieu, and Race branch, St. Croix county.

Sections 43, 45 and 46 establish restrictive harvest regulations for largemouth and smallmouth bass, muskellunge and walleye on Sparkling lake, Vilas county for 7 years when they revert back to the existing regulations.

Section 44 increases the minimum length for muskellunge to 45" on Little Saint Germain lake, Vilas county, for 10 years, when it reverts back to 34".

Section 47 establishes Millpond Park pond, Walworth county, as an urban fishing water.

Section 52 creates a seasonal fish refuge from the first Saturday in September to October 15 on the Chippewa river from a point 1,000 feet below the Jim Falls dam and extending downstream to the new CTH Y bridge, Chippewa county.

Section 53 creates a seasonal fish refuge when posted from March 1 through May 15 on the Yellow river from the dam in Cadott downstream to the Main street bridge in Cadott, Chippewa county.

[NOTE: All citations to "Manual" in the comments below are to the Administrative Rules Procedures Manual, prepared by the Revisor of Statutes Bureau and the Legislative Council Staff, dated September 1998.]

2. Form, Style and Placement in Administrative Code

- a. That part of the analysis describing Section 16m should end with a period.
- b. In the text of the rule, four Section numbers are missing: 20, 28, 50 and 53. Also, two Sections are numbered incorrectly--16m and 29m. Section 1.04 (1), Manual, provides that the text of a rule should be divided into sequentially numbered Sections, denoted as Section 1, Section 2 and so forth. Thus, the rule Sections should be renumbered to include Sections 20, 28, 50 and 53 and to eliminate Sections 16m and 29m. The analysis should also be updated, since it explains each Section.
- c. In s. NR 20.03 (31), the first inserted comma on line 4 should follow, rather than precede, the stricken "and." Section 1.06 (1), Manual, provides that when material is deleted and material is added in the same location, the new underscored material always immediately *follows* the stricken material.
- d. The material in Sections 2 and 3 of the rule could be combined into a single Section, since the two Sections contain subsections of the same rule section that are affected by the same treatment. See s. 1.04 (2) (a) 4., Manual. The same comment pertains to the material in Sections 8 and 9, 29m and 30, 33 and 34, 40 and 41, 46 and 47 and 54 and 55.

- e. In s. NR 20.12 (4) (c), the word "Lake" on line 2 should not be capitalized, since it is not capitalized in the current rule. Also, for readability, the stricken "and" on line 3 should not be stricken.
- f. In the treatment clause to Section 17, a period should be inserted after the "2m.," since subdivisions are designated by a number followed by a period, per s. 1.03 (5), Manual. The remainder of the rule should be reviewed for other occurrences of this problem.
 - g. In s. NR 20.20 (33) (b) 3., the "2." in the second column of text should be a "3."
- h. In s. NR 20.20 (57) (f) 3., the "1." in the second column of text should be a "3." Also, for consistency with other provisions, the language should read: "Chetac lake, Birch lake."

5. Clarity, Grammar, Punctuation and Use of Plain Language

- a. In s. NR 20.10 (3m), it is suggested that the word "from" on line 2 be replaced by the word "beginning."
- b. In s. NR 20.20 (26) (f) 2m., the daily bag limit for brook trout is listed in the fifth column as "none" until November 15, 2011. Thus, it appears that on November 15, 2011, some brook trout may be caught. However, the final column indicates that brook trout of eight inches may be taken after November 15, 2011. To reconcile the two provisions, it appears that the phrase "on or" should be inserted before the word "after" in the final column. The entire rule should be reviewed to ensure that the language clearly indicates the first and last days of specific periods of time.
- c. In s. NR 20.20 (35) (g) 1., in the phrase "including sloughs, bayous and flowages," a comma should be inserted and stricken through after the word "bayous" and the word "and" should be underscored. Also, compare this language to the language in s. NR 20.20 (37) (i) 1., where the phrase reads: "including *all* sloughs, bayous and flowages." Is there a reason for the inconsistency. The entire rule should be reviewed for occurrences of this problem.
- d. In the treatment clause to Section 56, the citation should read: "NR 26.01 (9) (a)." Also, in the text of this provision, the phrase "the old county highway Y bridge" is inserted. On the other hand, in Section 58, reference is made to "the old CTH Y bridge" and "the new CTH Y bridge." These two provisions should use consistent terminology to refer to that bridge. Similarly, the town and range descriptions should be expressed in a consistent format.

Section 1.06 (1), Manual, provides that when material is deleted and material is added in the same location, the new underscored material always immediately *follows* the stricken material.
- d. The material in Sections 2 and 3 of the rule could be combined into a single Section, since the two Sections contain subsections of the same rule section that are affected by the same treatment. See s. 1.04 (2) (a) 4., Manual. The same comment pertains to the material in Sections 8 and 9, 29m and 30, 33 and 34, 40 and 41, 46 and 47 and 54 and 55.

- e. In s. NR 20.12 (4) (c), the word "Lake" on line 2 should not be capitalized, since it is not capitalized in the current rule. Also, for readability, the stricken "and" on line 3 should not be stricken.
- f. In the treatment clause to Section 17, a period should be inserted after the "2m.," since subdivisions are designated by a number followed by a period, per s. 1.03 (5), Manual. The remainder of the rule should be reviewed for other occurrences of this problem.
 - g. In s. NR 20.20 (33) (b) 3., the "2." in the second column of text should be a "3."
- h. In s. NR 20.20 (57) (f) 3., the "1." in the second column of text should be a "3." Also, for consistency with other provisions, the language should read: "Chetac lake, Birch lake."

5. Clarity, Grammar, Punctuation and Use of Plain Language

- a. In s. NR 20.10 (3m), it is suggested that the word "from" on line 2 be replaced by the word "beginning."
- b. In s. NR 20.20 (26) (f) 2m., the daily bag limit for brook trout is listed in the fifth column as "none" until November 15, 2011. Thus, it appears that *on* November 15, 2011, some brook trout may be caught. However, the final column indicates that brook trout of eight inches may be taken *after* November 15, 2011. To reconcile the two provisions, it appears that the phrase "on or" should be inserted before the word "after" in the final column. The entire rule should be reviewed to ensure that the language clearly indicates the first and last days of specific periods of time.
- c. In s. NR 20.20 (35) (g) 1., in the phrase "including sloughs, bayous and flowages," a comma should be inserted and stricken through after the word "bayous" and the word "and" should be underscored. Also, compare this language to the language in s. NR 20.20 (37) (i) 1., where the phrase reads: "including *all* sloughs, bayous and flowages." Is there a reason for the inconsistency. The entire rule should be reviewed for occurrences of this problem.
- d. In the treatment clause to Section 56, the citation should read: "NR 26.01 (9) (a)." Also, in the text of this provision, the phrase "the old county highway Y bridge" is inserted. On the other hand, in Section 58, reference is made to "the old CTH Y bridge" and "the new CTH Y bridge." These two provisions should use consistent terminology to refer to that bridge. Similarly, the town and range descriptions should be expressed in a consistent format.

Section 1 establishes a possession limit of 10 for flathead catfish on the Lake Winnebago system for 10 years.

Section 2 prohibits the use or possession of artificial lights to shine any waters open to sturgeon spearing during the period from 48 hours before and continuing through the open sturgeon spearing season.

Section 3 prohibits the use of ice holes larger than 48 square feet for sturgeon spearing.

Section 4 prohibits the sale of flathead catfish taken by set or bank poles and setlines from the Lake Winnebago system and prohibits the sale of both channel and flathead catfish from the Fox river downstream from Lake Winnebago to the DePere dam.

Sections 5, 7, 8, 19, 24, 25, 27, 36, 37, 39, 40 and 52 establish a protected slot limit from 20" to 28", with only 1 > 28" for walleye, sauger and hybrids on the Wisconsin river from the Prairie du Sac dam, Columbia and Sauk counties, upstream to the Grandfather dam, Lincoln county and on the Yellow River upstream to the dam in Dexterville, Wood county and the Lemonwier river, for 5 years, when it reverts back to a 15" minimum length limit.

Sections 6, 54 and 55 establish a daily bag limit of 2 for flathead catfish on the Lake Winnebago system whether taken on hook and line, set or bank poles, or setlines for 10 years, when it reverts back to twice the daily bag limit.

Sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 38 and 41 increase the minimum length limit for walleye from 15" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on the lower Wisconsin river downstream from the Prairie du Sac dam, Columbia and Sauk counties.

Section 13 increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Beaver Dam lake, Dodge county.

Section 16m reduces the minimum length limit for muskellunge from 34" to 28" on Owl lake, Iron county;

Sections 17 and 18 establish catch-and-release only for brook trout on Graveyard creek, Iron county for 10 years.

Section 21 establishes catch-and-release only for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Yellowstone river upstream from CTH F, Lafayette county for 10 years, when it reverts back to a 14" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 5.

Section 22 eliminates the minimum length limit for bass on McGee lake, Langlade county.

Section 23 establishes a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Post lake (upper and lower), Langlade county.

Section 26 establishes a 26" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 2 for northern pike on Pike lake, Marathon county.

Section 29 increases the minimum length for muskellunge from 34" to 40" on Buckskin lake, Oneida county.

Section 29m rearranges the waters listed under special walleye regulations by lake chains, rather than listing the waters individually, and includes "connecting" waters between the listed lakes. This section also omits Hat Rapids flowage from the list of waters under this special walleye regulation for consistency with other connected waters;

Section 30 increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Maple lake, Oneida county.

Section 31 authorizes the harvest of 1 largemouth or smallmouth bass < 14" on Big Round lake and Balsam lake, Polk county for 10 years, when it reverts back to a 14" minimum length limit.

Section 32 increases the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass on the Wisconsin river from Stevens Point flowage dam to Al-Tech Park spillway, Portage county.

Sections 33 and 34 increase the minimum length limit from 14" to 18" and reduce the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 for largemouth and smallmouth bass on Jacqueline lake, Portage county.

Section 35 establishes a 32" minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 1 for northern pike on Jacqueline lake, Portage county.

Sections 42 and 51 establish a daily bag limit of 10 for bluegill on Chetac and Birch lakes, Sawyer and Washburn counties.

Section 43 increases the minimum length limit from 15" to 28" and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for walleye, sauger, and hybrids on Sand, Black Dan, Island, and Winter lakes, Sawyer county.

Section 44 increases the daily bag limit for trout from 1 to 3, reduces the minimum length limit from 16" to 12" for brown and rainbow trout and from 16" to 8" for brook trout, and eliminates the requirement for artificial lures on the Willow river downstream from Willow falls including Little Falls lake and Lake Mallalieu, and Race branch, St. Croix county.

Sections 45, 47 and 48 establish restrictive harvest regulations for largemouth and smallmouth bass, muskellunge and walleye on Sparkling lake, Vilas county for 7 years when they revert back to the existing regulations.

FINDING OF EMERGENCY

The Department of Natural Resources finds that an emergency exists and the foregoing rules are necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare. A statement of facts constituting the emergency is:

Spring viremia of carp virus is of international animal health concern. The virus effects fishes in the minnow family in nature. Minnows are extremely important forage fish for many important sport fishes in Wisconsin and are also important to the bait and aquaculture industries. Assuring the health of minnow populations and preventing the spread to other waters is important in preserving the welfare of Wisconsin citizens by protecting popular and economically valuable sport and bait fisheries. Little is currently known about the extent of the virus and until we can increase our knowledge, this closure will limit the potential spread from transport of fish and/or their parts and fluids.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on September 25, 2002.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on October 3 as emergency rules, as provided in s. 227.24(1)(c), Stats.
