Statement of Need

Under international treaty and federal law, migratory game bird seasons are closed unless opened annually via the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service regulations process. The federal regulations for seasons starting the Saturday nearest October 1 or later were established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in early August. Seasons were established for ducks, canvasbacks and Canada geese based on the federal regulations. A Canada goose bag limit was established for the youth waterfowl hunt.

Modifications as a Result of Public Hearings

The daily bag limit for ducks remains at 6, but the limit may include no more than 4 mallards, of which only one may be a hen, one black duck, one pintail, 2 wood ducks, 2 redheads and 3 scaup. Shooting of canvasbacks is prohibited from September 29 to October 19 and November 9 to November 27.

The Canada goose season was reduced from 73 days to 66 days in the Collins Zone, 94 days to 70 days in the Exterior Zone and 80 days to 70 days in the Mississippi River subzone.

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES AND CREATING

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to amend NR 10.01(1)(v), repeal and recreate NR 10.01(1)(b), (g)1.a. to k. and n., (g)2.a. to k., (g)3.a. to k., (u)1., and (u)2. and create NR 10.01(1)(d) relating to the 2001 migratory game bird season.

Statutory authority: ss. 29.014, 29.041, 29.197 and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.014, 29.041 and 29.197, Stats.

The proposed rules establish the regulations for the 2001 migratory game bird season. The significant regulations are:

Section 1. Ducks. The state is divided into two zones each with 60-day seasons. This year the northern and southern duck zone seasons will run concurrent. The season begins at noon September 29 and continues for 60 days, closing November 27. The daily bag limit is 6 ducks including no more than: 4 mallards, of which only one may be a hen, one black duck, one pintail, 2 wood ducks, 2 redheads and 3 scaup. Shooting of canvasbacks is prohibited from Sept. 29-Oct. 19 and Nov. 9-Nov. 27.

Canada Geese. The state is apportioned into 3 goose hunting zones: Horicon, Collins and Exterior. Other special goose management subzones within the Exterior Zone include Brown County, Burnett County, Rock Prairie and the Mississippi River. Season lengths are: Collins Zone - 66 days; Horicon Zone - 94 days; Exterior Zone - 70 days; and Mississippi River Subzone - 70 days. The Burnett County subzone is closed to Canada goose hunting.

Youth Waterfowl Hunt. The daily bag limit for Canada geese during the two day youth waterfowl hunt is created.

Section 2. This section creates a canvasback season starting Oct. 20 and continuing 20 days to Nov. 8. The daily bag limit is 1 and this duck shall be counted as part of the 6 duck daily bag limit.

Section 3. This section creates a daily bag limit for canvasback during the two day youth waterfowl hunt.

SECTION 3. NR 10.01(1)(v) is amended to read:

NR 10.01(1) (v) *Special youth waterfowl hunt event.* Persons 12 years of age or older but under 16 years of age who possess a certificate of accomplishment under s. 29.591, Stats., or its equivalent from another state or province, may hunt all species of wild ducks, mergansers, geese, coots, and gallinules for 2 consecutive days starting on the 14th day before the opening of the regular duck season. Approvals under ch. 29, Stats., are not required pursuant to s. 29.197 (1), Stats., except for registration in the harvest information program under s. NR 10.12 (11) and a Canada goose hunting permit, if hunting Canada geese. Daily bag limits are those described under s. NR 10.01 (1) (b), (c), (d) and (g) and all other waterfowl hunting regulations apply. Hunters shall be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older. One adult may not accompany more than 2 hunters.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on August 15, 2001

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.

- Mississippi River Subzone — 70 days

The Burnett County subzone is closed to Canada goose hunting.

Youth hunt- The Canada goose bag limit is established for the youth waterfowl hunt.

[NOTE: All citations to “Manual” in the comments below are to the Administrative Rules Procedures Manual, prepared by the Revisor of Statutes Bureau and the Legislative Council Staff, dated September 1998.]

4. Adequacy of References to Related Statutes, Rules and Forms

a. Section NR 10.32 is referenced several times in the rule. However, the reference refers to the “boundaries established” in s. NR 10.32. In fact, s. NR 10.32 creates two migratory game bird hunting zones. Although there is a boundary between the two zones, the purpose of that rule is to create the two zones. These references would be more accurate if they referred to the northern zone or the southern zone established under s. NR 10.32.

b. Section NR 10.01 (1) (g) 1. a. refers to “subpar. e.” The correct reference is “subd. 1. e.” This error should be corrected elsewhere in the rule also.

5. Clarity, Grammar, Punctuation and Use of Plain Language

The possession limit for geese in the Horicon zone, and at a number of other places, is “restricted by” a season limit that equals the number of carcass tags issued. “Restricted by” appears to be superfluous.
