Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

BILL SUMMARY:

-Current law requires courts to consider prior OWI and refusal convictions when determining the penalties for new impaired driving offenses. This bill requires courts to also consider convictions for operating an aircraft under the influence of alcohol or drugs under s. 114.09.

ASSUMPTIONS:

-DMV must post convictions for operating an aircraft under the influence to the driving record, so the convictions will be available for courts. The existing charge code for OWI convictions will be used.
-No driver's license revocation or driver safety plan is required for conviction under s. 114.09.

COST SUMMARY:

\$10,250 in one-time programming costs \$577 salary/fringe annually to add OWI convictions for s. 114.09 to driving records

BASIS FOR COST SUMMARY:

OWI convictions posted on driving records require a driver's license revocation/reinstatement and driver safety plan. Programming changes are needed to eliminate the dirver's license revocation/reinstatement and driver safety plan requirement for convictions under s. 114.09. Also, programming changes are needed to count convictions for s. 114.09 for subsequent OWI convictions when determining occupational eligibility and driver's license revocation.

There are 10,651 licensed pilots in Wisconsin. If 1% of these pilots are sanctioned for operating an aircraft under the influence per s. 114.09, this would create an additional workload of 107 cases per year for DMV. These cases will be manually added to the driving record, an increase of .02 FTE annually (\$577 salary/fringe). These costs can be absorbed.
