Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This legislation reduces the number of senate districts from 33 to 19 and the number of assembly districts from 99 to 57. The legislation requires the Legislative Council to introduce additional legislation implementing the provisions of this bill within 60 days of enactment.

The Legislative Council will incur drafting costs and the costs associated with redistricting as result of passage and implementation of this legislation.

The State Elections Board will incur costs to reprogram its computer software to reflect the changes. It is estimated the costs will be in the neighborhood of \$10,000. The agency staff will have to spend approximately 100 hours to enter and proof data base changes.

A number of state agencies will be required to make changes in publications and website information to reflect the new legislative structure.
