Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This bill prohibits a person from operating a boat that is less than 26' in length, during the time the boat is under way, unless persons 12 years old or younger are wearing a personal floatation device (PFD). The bill contains an exemption to wearing a PFD if persons 12 years old or younger are in a cabin space or below deck. Current operating boating law states that a PFD must be on board the boat for each person aboard. This bill makes state law consistent with federal laws relating to PFDs.

Fiscal Estimate Summary: There will be no fiscal impact. More detail on assumptions is provided below.

Public Information Costs: While there will be a need to increase public awareness of the new law, this will be accomplished by offsetting current public service announcements and will not create an additional cost to the state.

Law Enforcement Workload: Given confusion over inconsistencies between the current state law and federal law and the fact that this bill clarifies the two laws, the Warden time spent on enforcing the new law will be offset by work no longer performed under the current law: This bill will reduce current calls due to the conflicting federal and state laws that exist on wearing PFDs. Since Wisconsin is only one of four states that does not have this law (there are also currently two neighboring states with legislation pending), this would also reduce conflicts with tourists who are already complying with this law in their states. In addition, Wisconsin citizens also live under two different PFD rules. Any joint jurisdiction (federal/state) waters must comply with a similar federal law already. When persons boat on state-only waters, they then revert back to state law. This has caused much confusion in the boating community and generated an informational outreach workload already. This law would eliminate this cost and workload.
