Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The State Public Defender (SPD) provides legal representation in criminal cases and other specified proceedings in which the loss of personal liberty or parental rights may occur. For adult clients, the SPD must complete a financial eligibility evaluation before appointing an attorney. SPD services are constitutionally required because in the case types handled by SPD, a defendant without the financial means to hire an attorney has the right to have an attorney appointed. Therefore, any bill that would increase the number of cases handled by SPD would increase SPD costs.

This bill creates a new criminal offense for interference with a 911 call. Thus, SPD costs would be increased for each case in which SPD is required to appoint counsel. To the extent that charges might have been brought under another criminal statute under existing law (such as disorderly conduct, damage to propoerty, or false imprisonment), these increased costs would be mitigated. Because of the possibility in some cases for other charges under current law, it will be difficult to determine the precise impact of the new statute, but SPD can track the number of cases once it takes effect.

Other state and county agencies may also incur increased costs as a result of additional court proceedings and jail inmates.
