## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This fiscal estimate is based on the passage of Assembly Amendment 1 to 2005 Assembly Bill 574. The amended bill prohibits certain negative option billing practices for consumer goods or service and no longer requires specific regulation of lawn care service contracts.

Based on experience, the Department still projects that complaints regarding general billing practices will significantly increase and that a number of these complaints per year will require assignment to staff for further detailed investigation. Because these investigations typically involve multiple laws currently under our jurisdiction, we believe the costs associated with such work can be absorbed by the Department as a result of the changes to the bill.
