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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the involvement of military bases or installations (where relevant) into the planning and zoning processes of counties, cities, villages, and towns. These processes include new zoning ordinances, development plans, master plans, or amendments of existing ordinances or plans. According to information from the Intergovernmental Relations Division at the Department of Administration, Wisconsin has four military installations: Fort McCoy, Volk Field, Mitchell Air Field, and Truax Air Field. Political subdivisions that include these installations within their boundaries, or are located near the installations will be affected; however, Commerce is unable to determine the fiscal effect on these political subdivisions, in terms of additional workload or other administrative costs.

This bill is not likely to have a fiscal effect on the Department of Commerce.
