Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

- 1. Assume the bill would allow local governments to allow or permit parking on lanes of highways under their jurisdiction now reserved for highway travel.
- 2. Assume the bill passage could affect existing cost-share policies between the state and Milwaukee when existing highways are reconstructed. The state does not fund lanes desired by local governments for parking. Under this bill, a community could wait until lanes are constructed at state expense and then convert them to local parking use.
- 3. Assume the parking spaces could be installed on any highway including a state trunk highway in Milwaukee.
- 4. Assume that Milwaukee would lose connecting highway aid so local revenues would decrease.
- 5. Assume the costs the city would incur to change signs with the new authority would not be significantly different than costs for current parking regulation.
- 6. Assume the fines and the cost of enforcement are revenue neutral.
- 7. Assume SEG state fund sources affected would be 20.395(3)(cq) and 20.395 (1)(fq).

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The way the bill is written, Milwaukee could put parking on any highway under its parking jurisdiction in Milwaukee, including a state trunk highway. This would affect the available highway lanes reserved for traffic use. When this occurs, it is likely Milwaukee would lose connecting highway aid from the state due to the reduction in lane miles used to calculate the aid payment.
