Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If enacted, this bill would authorize county employed emergency medical technicians to receive length of service awards based on a combination of local contributions and state match.

The Emergency Medical Services Association estimates there are between five and ten qualifying county EMT departments with an average of 25 individuals per department. After adjusting for the consumer price index, the maximum state contribution for fiscal year 2005 would be \$274.33 per participant. Consequently, the maximum contribution would be \$68,600 for fiscal year 2005. Depending on the number of participating departments, actual expenditures may be less than this amount.

Since the department already manages the Volunteer Firefighter and Medical Technician Program, additional administrative costs would be minimal.
